Grant application form

The Huddersfield Education Trust is a charity which promotes the education of young people under 23 years of age. To be considered for a grant, those benefiting must be living in one of the 11 wards of the former County Borough of Huddersfield and are considered to be in need of assistance. Huddersfield Education Trust provides grants to groups, or for schemes providing educational facilities for those eligible. Grants are not given directly to individuals.

The 11 wards covered are:

1. Almondbury
2. Newsome
3. Milnsbridge
4. Lindley
5. Birkby
6. Deighton
7. N Central Huddersfield
8. S Central Huddersfield
9. Longwood
10. Fartown
11. Dalton

Any proposals for funding should not seek to replace statutory provision and preference will be given to those based on matched funding.

Please note, that while the Trustees are anxious to assist in as many projects as possible the funds available are limited and substantial grants cannot be expected.

Grant applications are considered at a Spring meeting.

The decisions of the Trustees are made as a result of a majority vote although urgent requests for assistance may be considered by at least two Trustees between meetings.

The Trust is administered by Trustees appointed by the Church of England Deaneries of Huddersfield and Almondbury, from the Free Churches of Huddersfield, the Religious Society of Friends and the local education authority.
