CAMHS

CAMHS stands for Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services

The services offer advice, assessment and treatment when children and young people have emotional, behavioural or mental health difficulties

Kirklees is looking to improve these services for young people and their families by 2020

The Kirklees CAMHS Transformation Plan aims to:

- Promote resilience, prevention and early intervention
- 2. Improve access to effective support
- 3. Care for the most vulnerable
- 4. Be accountable and transparent
- 5. Develop workforce skills

Kirklees CAMHS structure

ASK CAMHS is a single point of access providing advice, signposting or access to services including:

- ChEWS Tier 2 a service providing short term non urgent interventions.
- CAMHS Tier 3 a specialist service providing assessments, diagnosis and treatment of complex conditions.
- Eating Disorder Service a regional service accessible locally for serious eating disorder conditions.
- Crisis Team a service for children and young people in crisis.

In 2017 we aim to:

- Have funded a new Autism Spectrum Disorder provision
- Provide a new provision for the most vulnerable; looked after children, child sexual exploitation and young offenders.
- Offer easier access to appropriate support
- Reduce waiting times
- Improve communication with referrers
- Improve CAMHS links with schools
- Start re-designing CAMHS within the Healthy Child Programme
