

GAMBLING ACT 2005: CONSULTATION OF REVISED STATEMENT OF GAMBLING POLICY PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Kirklees Council's current statement of gambling policy was adopted by Full Council on the 9th December 2015, and came into effect on the 31st January 2016.

Each licensing authority must prepare and publish a statement of gambling policy every three years. During each three year period, a licensing authority must keep its policy under review and make revisions as appropriate.

I write to inform you that Kirklees Council is now consulting on a revised statement of gambling policy. The consultation commences on the 17th September 2018 and will close on 26th October 2018.

The consultation has been designed to provide a wide selection of the Kirklees population with the opportunity to comment on the revised content detailed in the draft policy. The responsible authorities as well as organisations concerned with the social impact of gambling, faith groups, national bodies representing the gambling trade, plus representatives of local businesses are also being consulted.
