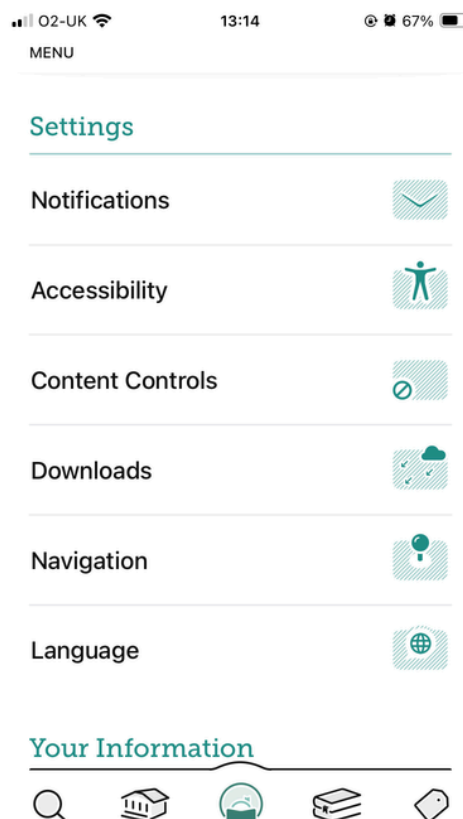
How to access the accessibility settings menu

The accessibility settings menu gives you a range of options to adjust the way Libby looks and acts to suit your needs. Here is how to access it in Libby.

1. In the libby app press the middle button at the bottom of the screen.



2. Slide your finger up to scroll the screen down until you see 'Accessibility'.

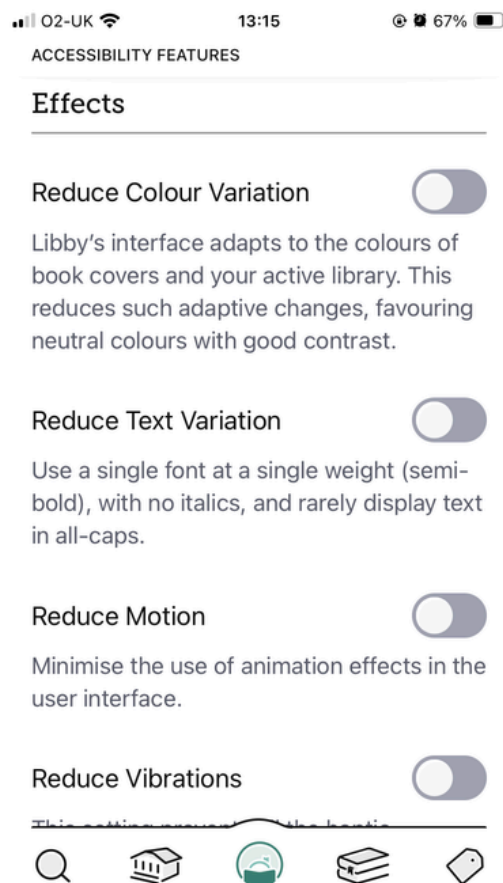

How to access the accessibility settings menu (continued)

3. Press 'Accessibility'.

This will open the accessibility settings menu, there are several options that you can turn on.



4. To turn a setting on, simply press the button to the right of the option.

How to change the appearance and size of text

1. Use either of the first two buttons in the bottom left of the screen to select an ebook or magazine.

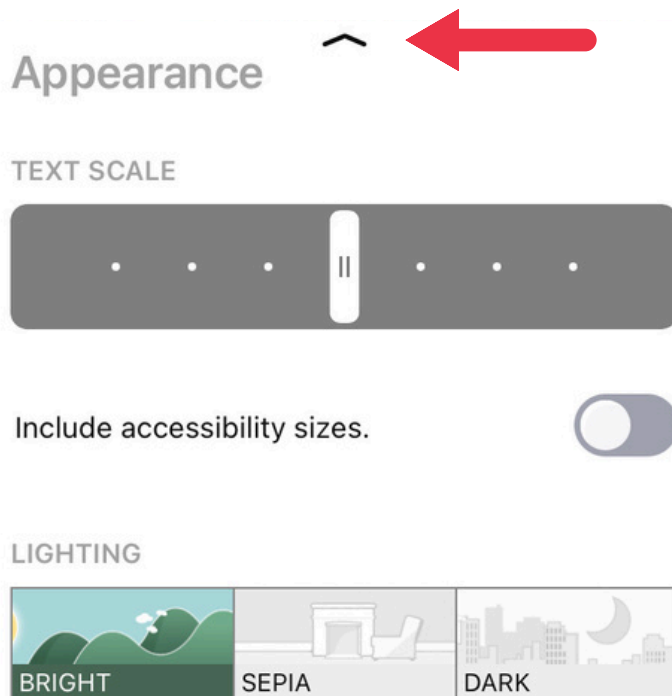


2. With the ebook or magazine open, select the 'A' icon in the top right of the screen.

If you cannot see this icon, press once in the middle of your screen.



3. You will see the following pop up, press the arrow just above the word 'Appearance'.

4. To adjust text size, drag this slider left or right.

TEXT SCALE



Include accessibility sizes.



5. If you need bigger text sizes, press the button next to 'Include accessibility sizes' and drag the slider left or right.

6. Under lighting, you can select one of the three options 'Bright', 'Sepia' or 'Dark' to change the appearance of Libby.

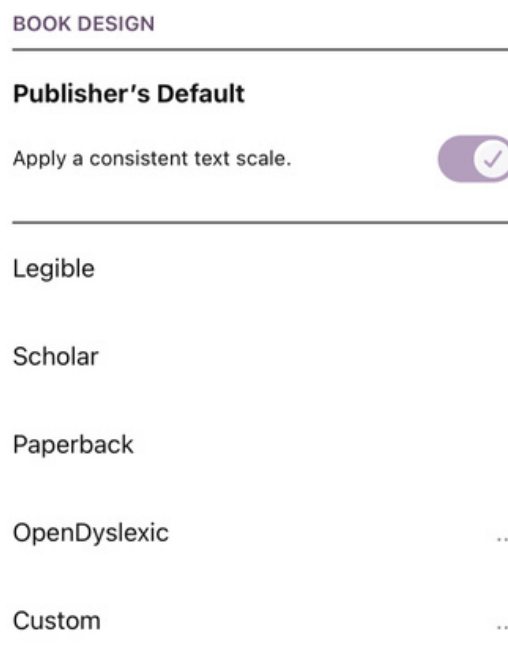

How to change the appearance and size of text (continued)

7. Drag your finger upwards to scroll further down the Appearance menu until you see the following.



8. Under book design, you can change the font of the text by selecting either 'Legible', 'Scholar', 'Paperback' 'OpenDyslexic' or 'Custom'.

9. Once you are happy with your text and lighting adjustments, you can exit the appearance menu by pressing once at the top of the screen. This will return you to the ebook or magazine.

Using zoom on magazines

Use the 2nd button from the bottom left of the screen to select a magazine.



To zoom in on a magazine page, pinch two fingers together, then place them on the screen and drag them away from each other in opposite directions.

The more you drag your fingers away, the more the screen will zoom in.

To zoom out, you do the opposite motion.

Place two fingers on the screen, away from each other and drag them until they are together, this will zoom the page out.

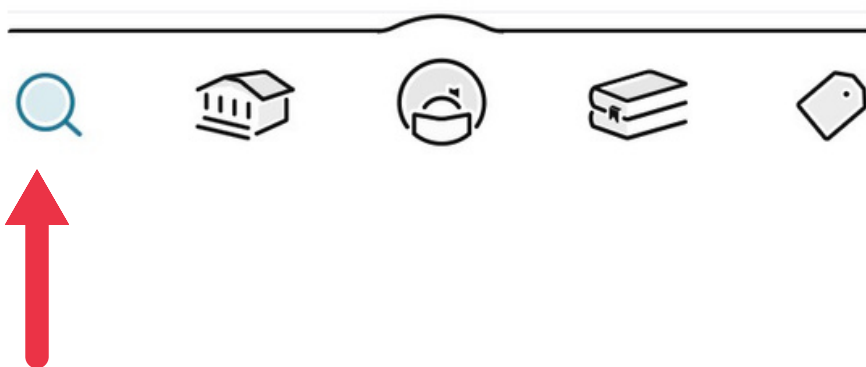
Accessing Audiobooks on Libby

Besides e-books, Libby also has a large collection of audiobooks.

When searching for a book, you can filter your search options so that you can search for audiobooks.

Here's how to do it:

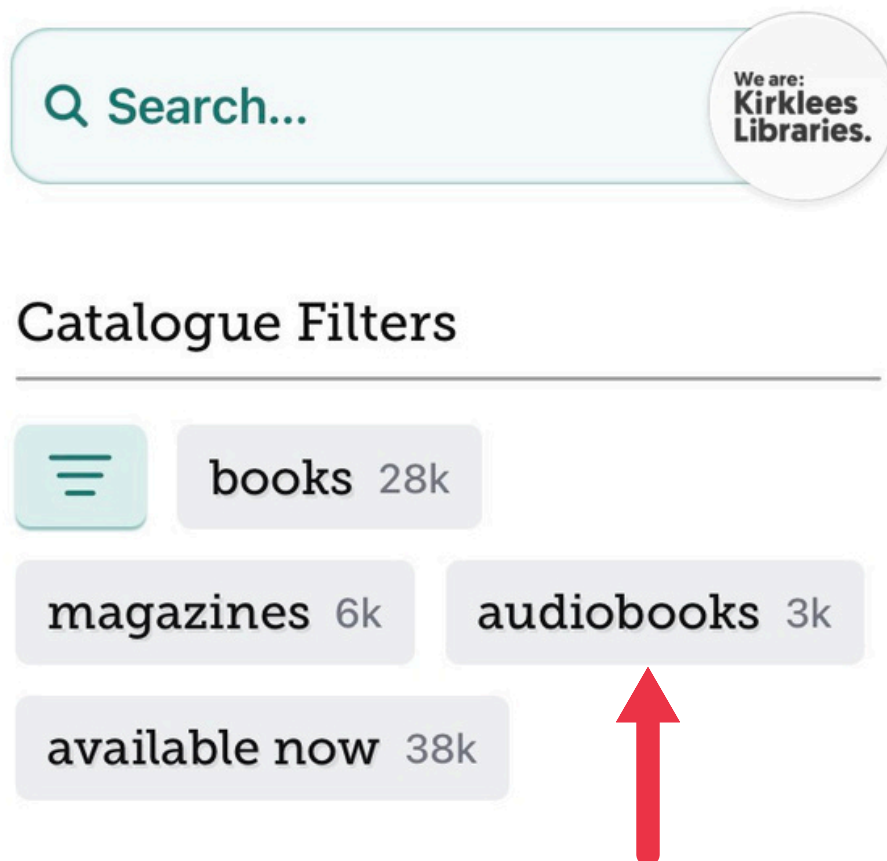
1. In the libby app, press the magnifying glass icon in the bottom left of your screen.

2. Under 'catalogue filters', select 'audiobooks'

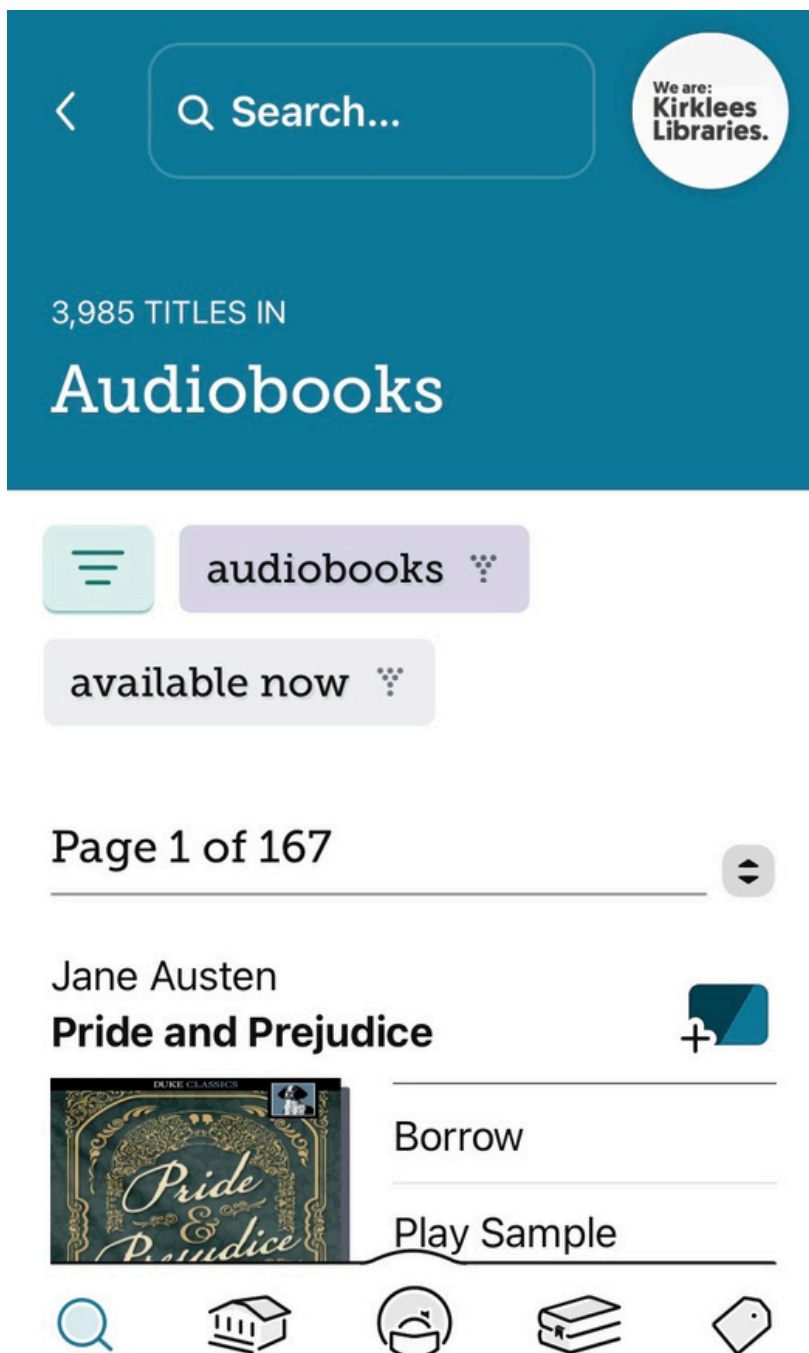


The number next to the word 'audiobooks' tells you the amount of audiobooks available in the catalogue, in this case 3000 audiobooks are available.

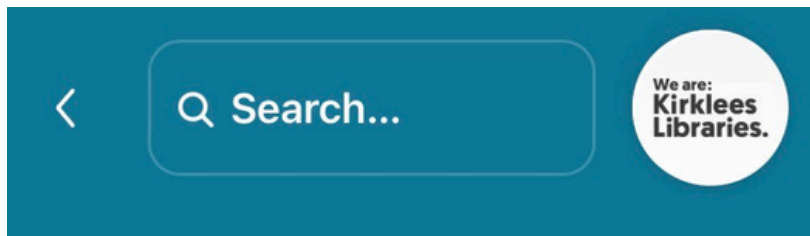
3. After pressing 'audiobooks' Libby will take you to a page that looks like this

4. You can also use the search bar at the top of the screen to search for audiobooks by title and/or author



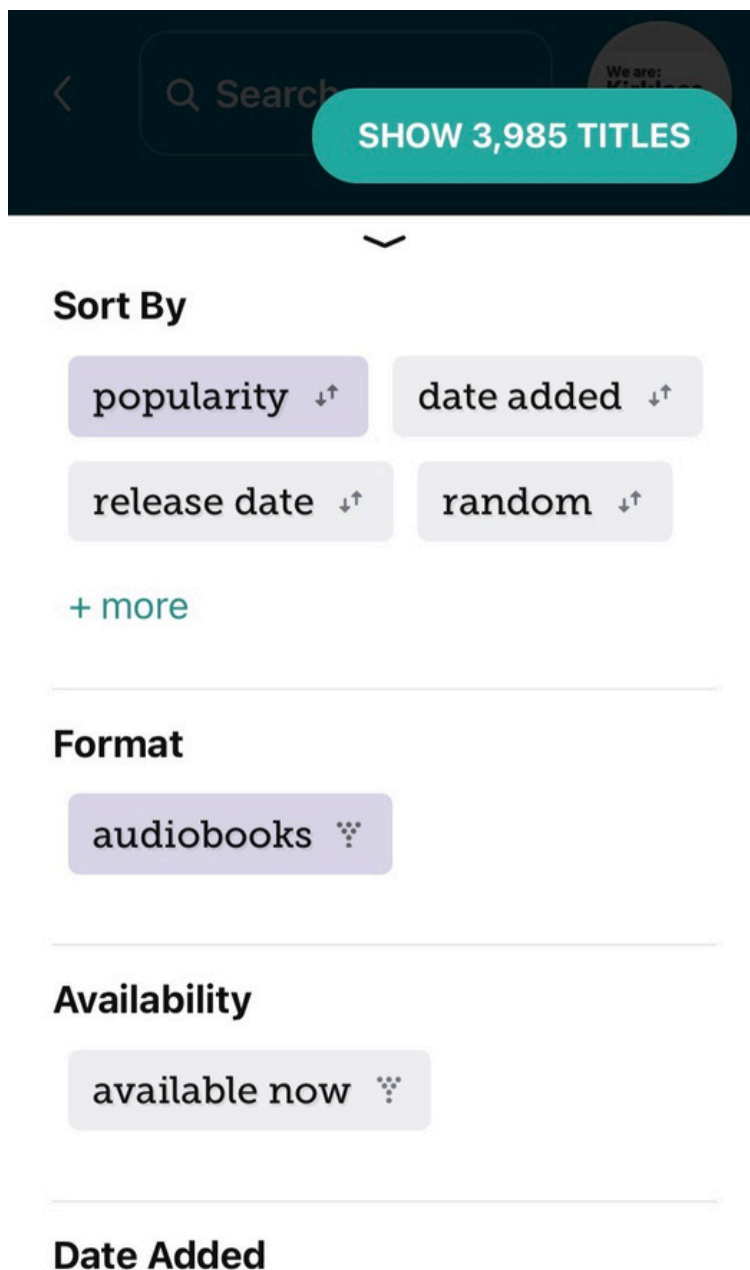
5. You can also add additional filters to your search by pressing this button:
