

Design and Access Statement

Woodroyd Chapel, Hall Ing Lane, Honley, Holmfirth HD9 6QW

Proposed replacement external door

March 2016

Woodroyd Chapel was built as a church in 1840 with later additions to the north and south. It is a grade two listed building. Listed Building Consent for the conversion to a dwelling was granted in December 1984, ref 84/65/01202/C3 after the building ceased to be used as a chapel.

The purpose of the application is to obtain consent to change the existing fully glazed external door to the east elevation which serves the kitchen to a partially glazed door. The existing door was fitted as part of the original conversion in 1987 and has deteriorated to an extent that replacement is necessary. The door fitted prior to this time was a simple flush door with no glazing, and this part of the building was used as a vestry at that time.

The door proposed would be a partially glazed painted timber type, 44mm thick, with bottom panel mouldings to reflect the adjacent existing double doors which were the main access to the chapel. The door would also be more thermally efficient by using double glazing. The existing door frame would be retained and not altered as part of the work.

Details of the proposed door accompany the application.
