Photograph 1 shows the site from the main street, approaching from the East. This is when the annex is first visible

Photograph 2 shows the site from the main street, approaching from the East. This is when the west elevation of cladding can be seen in the distance, along with the lower elevation of cladding.

Photograph 3 shows the view on the garage, with the projected annex roof.

Approaching the property from the East on the lower section of Raikes Lane, despite the annex roof projection over the garage, it is not visible until the viewer is beyond the main house.

The only houses with a direct view of the annex roof is number 185 Raikes Lane and the semi-detached house at the entrance to Raikes Lane (lower). The large detached house at 185 could look into the garden of 183 Raikes Lane prior to the annex construction. This is now largely blocked.

Whilst the area is predominantly red brick walls, on Briarmains Road, the most recent dwellings have large areas of render mixed with brickwork, along with slate roofs and dark window frames, leading towards a more modern, clean appearance. A similar look has been achieved with the rendered exterior of the annex. Similarly, the cladding panel, brickwork and render prevent an overwhelming large panel of a single material, which keeps the elevation more interesting than it would otherwise be.
