Re the above planning proposal.

I am writing again to completely oppose the proposed landfill of the Heckmondwike Railway cutting at the Walkley Lane entrance.

There is simply no way this area can with stand a project like this on such a massive scale.

The traffic on Church Street alone is now at danger point when the schools start and finish each day, cars are parked over permit areas, they block driveways, park in dangerous situations and there are heated exchanges and accidents from people on a frequent basis, how on earth could you consider adding to this wagons travelling around this area completing landfill??

This area houses a church which people are attending, it leads to Heckmondwike Grammar school, and to Cawley lane school, also the Jehovah's Witness church, the Grammar school annexe, a nursing home, a gym, it's a large residential area and there are several business at the bottom of the Street, you cannot believe that from a pure safety point of view that you can allow huge wagons to be travelling around this area with all these places that people are attending it would be madness.

Looking at access areas if they are using Walkley Lane area the traffic along the Heckmondwike road is at a standstill ALREADY in that area, and the turning into Walkley Lane is very difficult, how on earth are you going to add a building project congestion to this already over run area, and a project that is going to last for several years at that . You cannot subject residents to years of traffic chaos, fumes, pollution, danger, dust and take away one of the only green spaces we have to look over left that has not already been built on.

The area is completely over loaded with housing, the school places are at breaking point, the building has overtaken any green space left.

On a daily basis imagine how difficult it would be to live in this area with that huge amount of disruption, this is land fill we are talking about not just a few extra houses. Could you consider living in an area where wagons full of landfill are tipping every day? It would be inconceivable to subject people to this horror, from a health and a safety perspective alone.

I personally have lived in this are all my life and have gradually seen it overtaken by housing (we lost the grammar school football field to an estate ), the extensions to the Grammar School and the Annexe now, and the massive increase in traffic this has generated please do not punish the people who live in this area any further.
