To whom it may concern,

I wish to object to yet more building on the last few wild green spaces left in this area. I cannot think of a more inappropriate piece of land to use for building, the area is already too congested, which the council has previously agreed with when they initially refused the building of the housing estate called Horton Street. This was only allowed to eventually be built because, as I understand it, the council missed the closing date for refusal. This green open space is used recreationally by a great number of local people; for walking their dogs, having a stroll or just to de-stress away from this already built up area. Green unspoilt areas are well known to be beneficial to people's health and adds to their quality of life. It is also needed for the invaluable abundance of animal and insect life such as bees etc. There is little enough wild areas left for children to see and enjoy nature and to use to stay fit and healthy in natural surroundings while in a safe distance of their houses. Asthma is on the rise, mainly due to pollution from traffic in the vicinity, and the lack of air purifying trees without cutting down what is left. I think building contractors would better serve this community by finding more brown field sites to build on and leave alone what little wild green sites we have left before they are all gone.
