Type of comment: A general comment
<p>The part of Bridon Way backs onto a public footpath which runs alongside the site in question. It looks as if a boundary wall for the site is currently being built. However it is being built several metres inside the real boundary of the site. This will give rise to an area of 'no mans land' between the public footpath and the wall being built.</p> <p>The real boundary is a poor condition mesh fence at the side of the footpath. About a metre within that boundary fence is a galvanised metal fence and then further inside that is the new wall (If that is what it is meant to be).</p> <p>There is already a strip of 'no mans land' between the two fences mentioned. This wall will increase the size of the 'no mans' land which is heavily overgrown with self rooted saplings and shrubs. It affects the light . Neither the council (owners of the footpath) or the owners of the land are concerned about the upkeep.</p> <p>have reached as far inside to try to thin out the wooded area. The owners of the land should deal with maintenance right up to the real boundary, and not just up to the new wall.</p> <p>I have mentioned this boundary problem before on previous applications and spoke to Bill at the planning office several times.</p> <p>I will elaborate further if required but please note that I .</p>
