**Subject:** Planning Application 2019/90988

Dear Sir/Madam

The new planning application (2019/90988) is for a higher level of activity and use of the site:

- The original application was for small groups of supervised children visiting the site during daylight hours with no more than 15 people to use the site at any one time
  - The new proposal is for 24 hour use, access and egress to the site with the potential for 40 plus people and possibly dogs etc when fully occupied – this would have a major impact on our home
  - I have grave concerns about the level of noise this could generate at anytime of the day or night
  - The access to the site crosses a busy pathway where the visibility is very limited with the likelihood that an accident/s may occur with the extra traffic some of which may be large motorhomes as the new planning application proposes
  - I have concerns about the safety of those using the site due to lack of supervision with only one full time and one part time employee proposed
  - Anti-social behaviour is a real possibility, not just confined to those living close the site but to residents along Warehouse Hill Road, Lakeside etc. This is a quiet, residential community and I would suggest not the right location for a holiday camp
  - The proposed site has an abundance of wildlife and fauna living in it. If, as the police recommend, street lighting and cameras are installed – how will this affect the wildlife which includes bats, foxes, rare fauna to name but three – has this been considered?
  - With the latest fires in the surrounding area there is another potential problem of barbeques and open fires getting out of control and causing harm to campsite users, local residents, wildlife and a greenbelt area – trees are essential for our environment

In conclusion I wish to register my objection to the planning application 2019/90988. I should be grateful to receive acknowledgement of this email.
