

Design And Access Statement

Shoulder Of Mutton, 9 Church Street, Saithwaite, **Huddersfield, HD7 5AS**

1.Introduction

This Statement has been produced to accompany our Advertisement and Listed Building consent for additional and replacement signage for The Shoulder Of Mutton public house.

2.Current Use

The Shoulder of Mutton is a Grade II listed public house.

3.Purpose of the Planning application and listed building application.

To gain consent for the installation of additional signage to the exterior of the building.

4.Proposed Works

Signs A is a new fascia sign with individual letters and a signwritten logo, illuminated by LED floodlights. The fascia provides a like for like replacement of the one currently in place on the front elevation. The proposed lighting provides an energy efficient alternative to the trough lighting currently in place.

Signs B are two new large amenity/gable signs. The proposed amenity board to the front elevation provides a like for like replacement of the existing amenity board in place. The proposed amenity board to the right hand gable offers a replacement to the fascia letters currently in place. The proposed lighting again provides an energy efficient alternative to the lighting currently in place.

Sign C is one new set of 10mm perspex house name letters with signwritten secondary detail. This sign provides a like for like replacement for the one currently in place on the left hand gable. Again, the proposed lighting provides an energy efficient alternative. As with all the lighting on the proposed scheme the floodlighting will be directed into the building in order to prevent light spillage.

Sign D provides a like for like replacement of the double-sided pictorial in place. The proposed sign is to be constructed from aluminum, fret cut with vinyl detail and is to be fixed to the existing bracket. This sign is to be illuminated by linolites which provide a more slimline, energy efficient alternative to those currently in place. As this sign provides a like for like replacement, with more energy efficient lighting, we would hope that this sign is viewed as an improvement.

Sign E provides a like for like alternative to the amenity board currently in place on the front elevation.

Sign F the proposed amenity boards again provide a like for like replacement of those currently in place. The new amenity boards provide a smarter, more balanced appearance to the elevations, whilst also having a more traditional feel.

Sign G the proposed lanterns provide a more traditional feel to the illumination of the proposed amenity boards and fascias.

Sign H are eleven new LED floodlights, required to illuminate the proposed signs. The proposed lighting provides an energy efficient alternative to the floodlighting currently in place. As stated previously, all lighting is to be directed into the building in order to prevent light spillage.

Sign J the proposed amenity board is to be fitted to the blocked-out window. The proposed sign allows the business to advertise the amenities available, whilst also providing balance to the scheme on the proposed elevations.

In addition to the proposed signs the building is to be repainted in heritage colours using the following:
