

Consultation Response from KC Highways

This application seeks outline approval to the erection of one detached dwelling at land adjacent to 320, New Hey Road, Oakes, Huddersfield.

The proposed access from New Hey Road currently serves 4 dwelling including 318, 320, 322 and 324 New Hey Road. This proposal will result in a total of 5 dwelling being served from an existing shared private driveway.

Outline planning permission was granted for the construction of a detached house on the site in 2012 - Application number 2012/93585

Plan number 1895/01 shows a detached dwelling with attached garage to the side and a single parking space on a proposed driveway to the front of the garage.

The application form refers to a 3 bedroomed dwelling.

Given the previous approval and that this proposal will result in only 5 dwelling being served by the existing private driveway Highways Development Management have no objection to these proposals and have no wish to resist the granting of planning permission.

Suggested condition:

Areas to be surfaced and drained

Prior to the development being brought into use, the approved vehicle parking areas shall be surfaced and drained in accordance with the Communities and Local Government; and Environment Agencies 'Guidance on the permeable surfacing of front gardens (**parking areas**)' published 13th May 2009 (ISBN 9781409804864) as amended or superseded; and thereafter retained throughout the lifetime of the development.

Reason: In the interests of highway safety and to achieve a satisfactory layout

Footnote;

The granting of planning permission does not authorise the carrying out of works within the highway, for which the written permission of the Council as Highway Authority is required. You are required to consult the Design Engineer (Kirklees Street Scene: 01484 221000) with regard to obtaining this permission and approval of the construction specification. Please also note that the construction of vehicle crossings within the highway is deemed to be major works for the purposes of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (Section 84 and 85).
