I wish to raise both comments and objection to this plan.

- The A653 is a trunk road and meant to enable traffic to flow through. Having lived at the same property for over 20 years it currently takes between 20 and 30 minutes at times to get from Bennett lane to Woodkirk Babes in the Wood lights. I often join the queue at Bennett Lane. A build of this degree will force up-to 5000 more cars per day utilising that stretch of road.

- prior to this, I grew up from 6months old to 21 living at woodkirk opposite the green space, woods and beautiful bluebell,woods and places to walk safely, where will the locals go now on foot?

- whilst those across the borders come to live in this area, they do,so because the cost saving in terms of property purchase in comparison to Leeds and Wakefield

- we have a national target and local authority target for green space, reducing carbon emissions and removing the woodlands and green space causes a large deficit and reverse effect on that target.

- the development is going to destroy wildlife in terms of their natural homes, their families and their habitat, we need bees and the natural food chain to continue.

- we have an infant and primary school locally and the detriment to them and the risk provides a likely negative impact and major disruption causing a substantial impact

- GP practices in this area, particularly in Dewsbury are at stretched capacity already with minimum access to grants to extend the buildings and gain resources to provide services. The focus of the local CCGs is on secondary care and phase 3 covid needs. Stop putting out clinical staff under this extreme pressure. For each 1000 houses built, the government needs to fund and put in place 2 GPs and 1 Nurse plus the infrastructure around them. 2500 homes can equate to 10000 people, that needs 4 GPs, 2 ANPs, 2 practice nurses and healthcare assistants plus the non clinical,support staff and the building to deliver from. That means over £1m per year funding.

Dewsbury is not an area that attracts clinical resources as the £ per patient paid to general practice in Kirklees is almost 50% lower than Wakefield so they cannot provide sufficient attractive salaries. Where are all these people going to,register?

- the local,hospital,redesign moved most services to Wakefield and with the downgrading of A&E and maternity, where are these new residents going, to the same places stretching local waiting times further for all.

Yes more houses are needed, but not here in this location where the supporting infrastructure is insufficient to cope.
