<p>There are several issues with the proposed development.</p> <p>There have already been a significant number of new properties built in the area including in Wakefield and Leeds boundaries. Already overloading the local roads and national highways an issue for health, safety and wellbeing. The extra cars plus HGV access from the Motorways for the industrial development M62 J28 and M1 J40 already struggling with the existing usage and with further construction yet to be completed will be pushed beyond reasonable limits. The traffic reports even seem to acknowledge this but then shrug and say well tough.</p> <p>The removal of valuable agricultural land which will be needed far more than housing to reduce the cost of living and ensure uninterrupted food supplies seems short sited.</p> <p>The significant loss to the environment of much needed green space both for the wildlife and for the existing residents. The damage/litter/pollution that will occur in the two ancient woodlands from the increase in nearby people will irreversible. While there are still many brown field sites available for development. The use of green field sites (Especially those that were recently designated green belt) should be a last resort and only developed on when no other possible options are available. Further with industrial development included there will certainly be an increase in pollution and noise pollution in the area.</p> <p>Already struggling local amenities police, GPs, etc will be further stressed</p> <p>I note that previously planning applications for this area were rejected as it was designated green belt. Then the green belt designation was removed, and almost identical land usage application has been put back in.</p> <p>I'm sure much will be made of an increase in jobs. But the vast majority of those will be temporary as part of the construction process. All this permanent damage and loss for short term profit of a small minority of people.</p>
