Impact on highway safety and traffic - Blackmoorfoot Road is already a very busy road, in parts there is only sufficient space for one vehicle to pass through, so at busy times of the day, cars etc are backed up in both directions. 770 houses will significantly increase the volume of traffic in both directions and, and it could potentially impact traffic going through Linthwaite/Cowersley and Lockwood as people try to find alternative routes to quicken their journey. There is already an issue with cars speeding up and down Blackmoorfoot Road which can be very dangerous for both vehicles and pedestrians from roads etc joining onto the main road. Will there be investment in traffic control such as traffic lights, pedestrian crossings, speed bumps? Construction Traffic – building 770 homes will mean a large number of wagons continually using Blackmoorfoot Road which will further impact highway safety and traffic and also have a damaging impact on the road surface. Noise disturbance - the building site will create noise and disturbance will cause over a number years until the development is be completed which particularly for residents living in very close proximity will have a detrimental effect on health Local schools, doctors & dentists – schools in the area are already at breaking point. Where are the places going to be found for the children from the development? Likewise it is virtually impossible to get a doctor's appointment at any of the local surgeries within 2 weeks. The same applies for local dentists. The building of the site on the former St Luke's Hospital is already going to introduce a further influx of families which will be impacting on the highways, need to access healthcare services and need school places so the allow a further 770 houses to be built in such close proximity will have a major detrimental impact to residents of Crosland Moor/Crosland Hill.
