PLANNING PERMISSION FOR DEVELOPMENT

In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Order the KIRKLEES COUNCIL (hereinafter called "The Council") as Local Planning Authority hereby permits:-

ERECTION OF EXTENSIONS AND ALTERATIONS TO FRONT, SIDE AND REAR,
FORMATION OF RAISED TERRACE, ERECTION OF DETACHED GARAGE

At: 2, LITTLE LANE, WOOLDALE, HOLMFIRTH, HD9 1QF

In accordance with the plan(s), documents and application submitted to the Council on 09-Dec-2020, except as amended or specified, details of which can be found in the table below and subject to the condition(s) specified hereunder:-

1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within three years of the date of this permission.

Reason: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and so as to ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, and to accord Policies LP1, LP2, LP21, LP22, LP24, LP28, LP30 and LP34 of the Kirklees Local Plan and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

3. The stonework used on the front elevation of the first floor side extension, single storey front extension and detached garage hereby approved, shall in all respects match the stone used in the construction of the existing building, in accordance with the details shown on the approved plan.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and to accord with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

4. The render to be used on the side and rear elevations of the first floor side extension and single storey rear extension, shall in all respects match the render used in the construction of the existing building, in accordance with the details shown on the approved plan.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and to accord with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

5. The roofing materials of the extensions hereby approved shall in all respects match those used in the construction of the existing building, in accordance with the details shown on the approved plan.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and to accord with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

6. The extensions hereby approved shall not be brought into use until the extended driveway as indicated on the approved block plan (dwg no. 08 Rev A) has been laid out with a hardened and drained surface in accordance with the Communities and Local Government; and Environment Agency's 'Guidance on the permeable surfacing of front gardens (parking areas)' published 13th May 2009 (ISBN 9781409804864) as amended or any successor guidance; Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 as amended (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order) this shall be so retained, free of obstructions and available for parking.

Reason: In the interests of amenity and traffic safety, to ensure adequate space within the site for vehicle movements and parking and to ensure that the additional hardstanding area is appropriately drained to mitigate flood risk in accordance with Policies LP21, LP22, LP28 and LP34 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapter 14 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

7. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 as amended (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order) no doors, windows or any other openings (apart from any expressly allowed by this permission) shall be created in the northern facing side elevation of the single storey rear extension hereby approved.

Reason: So as not to detract from the amenities of neighbouring properties by reason of loss of privacy and to accord with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan.

8. Before the first floor terrace and rear decking is first brought into use, a 1.8m high obscurely glazed privacy screen shall be erected along the North Boundaries. The privacy screens shall thereafter be retained.

Reason: So as not to detract from the amenity of adjoining property by reason of loss of privacy and to accord with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan.

NOTE: To minimise noise disturbance at nearby premises it is generally recommended that activities relating to the erection, construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of buildings, structures or roads shall not take place outside the hours of: • 07.30 and 18.30 hours Mondays to Fridays • 08.00 and 13.00hours, Saturdays • With no working Sundays or Public Holidays In some cases, different site specific hours of operation may be appropriate. Under the Control of Pollution Act 1974, Section 60 Kirklees Environment and Transportation Services can control noise from construction sites by serving a notice. This notice can specify the hours during which work may be carried out.

NOTE: Please note that the granting of planning permission does not overrule private legal rights of ownership and it is your responsibility to ensure you have the legal right to carry out the approved works as construction and maintenance or parking of vehicles may involve access to land outside your ownership or subject to private rights of way.

NOTE: Due to its location, a bat roost may be present on site. Bats are a European protected species under regulation 41 of the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010. It is an offence for anyone intentionally to kill, injure or handle a bat, disturb a roosting bat, or sell or offer a bat for sale without a licence. It is also an offence to damage, destroy or obstruct access to any place used by bats for shelter, whether they are present or not. If bats are discovered on site development shall cease and the applicant is advised to contact Natural England for advice.

NOTE: There is a culverted watercourse in which runs across part of the application site. This should be protected during the course of the construction phase.

Pursuant to article 35 (2) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2015 and guidance in the National Planning Policy Framework, the Local Planning Authority have, where possible, made a pre-application advice service available, complied with the Kirklees Development Management Charter 2015 and

otherwise actively engaged with the applicant in dealing with the application. In this instance, officers have entered into discussions with the applicant regarding the impact in which the development would have upon visual and residential amenity. As such, amendments have been sought to omit the projecting two storey front extension, reduce the size and scale of the proposed garage and to alter the construction materials. These were received on the 28th January 2021. Further details regarding the retaining wall were submitted to the council alongside a landscaping plan. This was received on the 23rd February 2021.

Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your Local Planning Authority to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- As this is a decision for a householder application, if you want to appeal against your Local Planning Authority's decision to impose planning conditions then you must do so within 6 months of the date of this notice.
- If an enforcement notice is served or has been served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against the local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice.
- Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or online at <https://www.gov.uk/planning-inspectorate>. - You must use the correct Planning Appeal Form when making your appeal. If requesting forms from the Planning Inspectorate, please state the type of application that the appeal relates to so they can send you the appeal form you require.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the local planning authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.
- In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based their decision on a direction given by him.

Please note, only the applicant possesses the right of appeal.

Purchase Notices

- If either the local planning authority or the Secretary of State refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that the owner can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.

In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council. This notice will require the Council to purchase the owner's interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Chapter I of Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
