**In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Order the  
KIRKLEES COUNCIL (hereinafter called "The Council") as Local Planning  
Authority hereby permits:-**

CHANGE OF USE FROM DRINKING ESTABLISHMENT WITH FOOD  
PROVISION TO RESTAURANT CLASS E(B) WITH ANCILLARY LIVING  
ACCOMMODATION (WITHIN A CONSERVATION AREA)

**At:** GEORGE INN, 13, GEORGE STREET, KIRKBURTON, HUDDERSFIELD,  
HD8 0SF

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**In accordance with the plan(s) and applications submitted to the Council on 16-  
Dec-2020, subject to the condition(s) specified hereunder:-**

1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within three years of the date of this permission.

**Reason:** Pursuant to the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

**Reason:** For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and to ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, to preserve the significance of the Kirkburton Conservation Area and the grade II listed building, in accordance with Policies LP21, LP24 and LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

3. The application building shall not be occupied until the approved extract system has been installed and thereafter retained and maintained in accordance with the approved details.

**Reason:** To ensure the proposed development does not cause harmful odour pollution or at neighbouring premises in the interest of amenity, to comply with the aims and objectives of Policies LP16, LP24 and LP52 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapters 12 and 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

4. The restaurant use hereby permitted shall not be open to customers outside the hours of 16:00 to 23:00 Monday to Saturday, and 15:00 to 22:00 Sunday and Bank Holidays, and there shall be no deliveries to, or dispatches from the premises outside these hours. No deliveries shall take place on Sundays or Bank Holidays.

**Reason:** To ensure that the proposed use(s) does not give rise to the loss of amenity to nearby residential properties, by reason of noise or disturbance at unsociable hours, to accord with the aims of Policies LP24 and LP52 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapters 12 and 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

5. The first-floor ancillary living accommodation hereby approved shall not be occupied other than by the owner, member of staff or dependents thereof of the restaurant on the ground floor of the application building.

**Reason:** In the interest of residential amenity, to ensure the future occupiers of the first floor living accommodation are not exposed to an unacceptable level of noise and disturbance in unsocial hours and to accord with Policies LP16, LP24(c) and LP52 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapters 12 and 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

**NOTE:** Due to its location, a bat roost may be present on site. Bats are a European protected species under regulation 41 of the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010. It is an offence for anyone intentionally to kill, injure or handle a bat, disturb a roosting bat, or sell or offer a bat for sale without a licence. It is also an offence to damage, destroy or obstruct access to any place used by bats for shelter, whether they are present or not.

**NOTE:** It is recommended that prior to development commencing the applicant should contact the Food Safety Team of Environmental Services to arrange an advice visit to discuss food safety and hygiene requirements including an appropriate layout. In this case, the installation report has been revised to address the initial concern raised by the Environmental Health Officer. The revised report was submitted 10-Mar-2021. No further details or amendments were sought thereafter.

#### **Appeals to the Secretary of State**

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your Local Planning Authority to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- If an enforcement notice is served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against your Local Planning Authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within:
  - i) 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice, or
  - ii) within the specified period, starting on the date of this notice,whichever period expires earlier.
- If you want to appeal against your Local Planning Authority's decision then you must do so within the specified period, starting on the date of this notice.
- The "specified period" is 12 weeks where the development relates to a "minor commercial application" as defined within the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2010 (as amended), or 6 months in any other case.
- Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or online at <https://www.gov.uk/planning-inspectorate> . Further information on the Planning Appeal process can be found online at the Planning Inspectorates website <https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/planning-inspectorate>.
- You must use the correct Planning Appeal Form when making your appeal. If requesting forms from the Planning Inspectorate, please state the type of application that the appeal relates to so they can send you the appeal form you require.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the Local Planning Authority could not have granted planning permission

for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.

- In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based their decision on a direction given by him.

Please note, only the applicant possesses the right of appeal.

#### **Purchase Notices**

- If either the Local Planning Authority or the Secretary of State refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.

In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council. This notice will require the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
