REFUSAL OF LISTED BUILDING CONSENT

The KIRKLEES COUNCIL hereby give notice that LISTED BUILDING CONSENT has been refused for the execution of the works referred to:-

LISTED BUILDING CONSENT FOR INSTALLATION OF ATM

At: JERK HUT, 160, MANCHESTER ROAD, LONGROYD BRIDGE,
HUDDERSFIELD, HD1 3JA

In accordance with the plan(s) and applications submitted to the Council on 22-Apr-2021. The reasons for the Council's decision to refuse consent for the development are:

1. The proposed ATM, by introducing an additional modern element in a prominent location of the building, would not preserve or enhance the building's special architectural and historic interest and would cause harm to its significance. The harm caused is considered to be less than substantial harm, however, as required by paragraph 193 of the NPPF, great weight has been given to that harm in assessing the impact of the proposed works. Clear and convincing justification has not been provided for the harm caused. Public benefits have not been demonstrated that would outweigh the harm caused in this case. The development would therefore be contrary to the Council's duties under Section 16(2) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, Policy LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Paragraphs 190, 193, 194 and 196 of National Planning Policy Framework.

NOTE: This application has considered the ATM only. It should be noted that the existing shopfront, roller shutter and UPVC windows within the building do not have from listed building consent.
