**Subject:** Tree report

I attended the address, 22 woodlea Avenue, huddersfield HD3 4EF

I was present to give my professional opinion on a large beech tree located to the rear of the property.

Upon inspection it is clear to see there is visible deadwood along most limbs.

At around 15 feet high from ground level there is an open cavity at the base of a large limb. While inspecting the open wound it is clear that there is signs of rot and decay measuring atleast 3 feet deep inside the tree. The open wound goes directly into the main stem and will most definitely be spreading.

In my opinion the tree should be removed on the grounds of health and safety or at minimum the large limb should be removed but taking into consideration the possibility of rot /decay going deep into the main stem and removing the large limb alone could affect the root plate and unbalance the tree then I would advise the whole tree to be removed.

Due to its location it would also have a detrimental impact on the occupiers if it should fall or lose the large limb.

As there is a large woodland behind the property removing the tree in question would not have an impact on wildlife in the area.
