In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Order the KIRKLEES COUNCIL (hereinafter called "The Council") as Local Planning Authority hereby permits:-

DEMOLITION OF EXISTING BUILDING AND ERECTION OF 2 SEMI-
DETACHED DWELLINGS (WITHIN A CONSERVATION AREA)

At: LAND BETWEEN, 27 & 35, ROYDS AVENUE, LINTHWAITE,
HUDDERSFIELD, HD7 5QU

In accordance with the plan(s) and applications submitted to the Council on 01-Jun-2021, subject to the condition(s) specified hereunder:-

1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within three years of the date of this permission.

Reason: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and so as to ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion and in the interests of highway safety in accordance with Policies LP1, LP2, LP3 LP21, LP22, LP24, LP28, LP30, LP34, LP51 and LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principles 2, 5, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 19 of Council's adopted Housebuilder Design Guide, Chapters 2, 5, 12, 14, 15 and 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework and Section 72 of the Town & Country Planning (Listed Buildings & Conservation Areas) Act 1990.

3. The dwellings hereby approved shall be constructed from natural stone, with blue slate tiles to the roofs, in accordance with the submitted plans. The development shall thereafter be retained with this finish.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and to accord with Policies LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan Principles 2 and 13 of the Council's adopted Housebuilder Design Guide and Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

4. Before occupation, one electric vehicle recharging point shall be provided in the parking area/integral garage of each dwelling. Cable and circuitry ratings shall be of adequate size to ensure a minimum continuous current demand of 16 Amps and a maximum demand of 32Amps. The electric vehicle charging point so installed shall thereafter be retained.

Reason: To encourage ultra-low emission vehicles in the interests of air quality and accord with the guidance contained in Policies LP24 and LP51 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principle 18 of the Council's adopted Housebuilder Design Guide, Chapters 9, 14 and 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework and the West Yorkshire Low Emissions Strategy

5. Each dwelling shall not be brought into use, until the new driveways indicated on the hereby approved Plan Dwg. no P03 Rev A, have been laid out with a hardened and drained surface in accordance with the Communities and Local Government; and Environment Agency's 'Guidance on the permeable surfacing of front gardens (parking areas)' published 13th May 2009 (ISBN 9781409804864) as amended or any successor guidance; Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 as amended (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order) this shall be so retained, free of obstructions and available for parking.

Reason: In the interests of amenity and traffic safety, to ensure adequate space within the site for vehicle movements and parking and to ensure that the additional hardstanding area is appropriately drained to mitigate flood risk in accordance with Policies LP21, LP22, LP28 and LP34 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapter 9 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 as amended (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order with or without modification) no development included within Classes A, B, C, D and E of Part 1 of Schedule 2 to that Order shall be carried out without within the site outlined in red on Dwg. No. P 01, prior written consent of the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: In the interests of visual and residential amenity and to ensure that the scheme would not result in the overdevelopment of the site, in accordance with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principles 17 and 19 of the Council's adopted Housebuilder Design Guide and Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

7. During the period of construction, one bat box, in the form of a Schweglar type 1FR woodcrete bat box or similar, or similar shall be incorporated into the southern facing side elevation of plot 2, at least 5 metres above ground level, and not above a door or window. The bat box provided shall be thereafter retained.

Reason: To enhance the biodiversity of the development and to accord with Policy LP30 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Chapter 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework and The Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017.

8. Where further intrusive investigation is recommended in the Preliminary Risk Assessment (Ref: M0159 CO (GSI1510) PI Report TB 010721), groundworks shall not commence until a Phase II Intrusive Site Investigation Report has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraphs 178 and 179 of the National Planning Policy Framework. This is a pre commencement condition as remediation measures may be necessary before work can commencement on the construction of the development hereby approved.

9. Where site remediation is recommended in the Phase II Intrusive Site Investigation Report approved pursuant to condition (8) further groundworks shall not commence until a Remediation Strategy has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The Remediation Strategy shall include a timetable for the implementation and completion of the approved remediation measures.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraphs 178 and 179 of the National Planning Policy Framework. This is a pre commencement condition as remediation measures may be necessary before work can commencement on the construction of the development hereby approved.

10. Remediation of the site shall be carried out and completed in accordance with the Remediation Strategy approved pursuant to condition (9). In the event that remediation is unable to proceed in accordance with the approved Remediation Strategy or contamination not previously considered [in either the Preliminary Risk Assessment or the Phase II Intrusive Site Investigation Report] is identified or encountered on site, all groundworks in the affected area (except for site investigation works) shall cease immediately and the Local Planning Authority shall be notified in writing within 2 working days. Works shall not recommence until proposed revisions to the Remediation Strategy have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Remediation of the site shall thereafter be carried out in accordance with the approved revised Remediation Strategy.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraph nos. 178 and 179 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

11. Following completion of any measures identified in the approved Remediation Strategy or any approved revised Remediation Strategy a Validation Report shall be submitted to the Local Planning Authority. No part of the site shall be brought into use until such time as the remediation measures have been completed for (that part of) the site in accordance with the approved Remediation Strategy or the approved revised Remediation Strategy and a Validation Report in respect of those remediation measures has been approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Where validation has been submitted and approved in stages for different areas of the whole site, a Final Validation Summary Report shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraph nos. 174, 183 and 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

12. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 as amended (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order). The integral garage for plot 2, as shown on the approved plans shall be retained for the parking of vehicles for the approved dwelling and shall not be converted to provide additional living accommodation without the prior express planning consent of the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To enable the Local Planning Authority to retain planning control over the development of this site in order to ensure adequate parking provision in accordance with Policies LP21 and LP22 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapter 9 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

13. The boundaries of the site shall be Stone walls to rear at a height as detailed upon submitted drawing P03revA, timber fence to rear at a height no greater than 1.8m above ground level and in the locations as shown upon submitted drawing P03revA and stone wall to front in the locations as shown upon submitted drawing P03revA and a height of no more than 1m above ground level.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and to accord with Policies LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan Principles 2 and 13 of the Council's adopted Housebuilder Design Guide and Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

NOTE: All contamination reports shall be prepared in accordance with *Model Procedures for the Management of Land Contamination – Contaminated Land report 11*, National

Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) and the Council's Advice for Development documents or any subsequent revisions of those documents.

NOTE: Construction working times Noisy construction related activities shall not take place outside the hours of:

07.30 to 18.30 hours Mondays to Fridays

08.00 to 13.00 hours, Saturdays

With no noisy activities on Sundays or Public Holidays.

Kirklees Council has powers under Section 60 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 to control noise from construction sites and may serve a notice imposing requirements on the way in which construction works are to be carried out. It has additional powers under Sections 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to prevent statutory nuisance including noise, dust, smoke and artificial light and must serve an abatement notice when it is satisfied that a statutory nuisance exists or is likely to occur or recur. Failure to comply with a notice served using the above mentioned legislation would be an offence for which the maximum fine on summary conviction is unlimited.

NOTE: Due to its location, a bat roost may be present on site. Bats are a European protected species under regulation 41 of the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010. It is an offence for anyone intentionally to kill, injure or handle a bat, disturb a roosting bat, or sell or offer a bat for sale without a licence. It is also an offence to damage, destroy or obstruct access to any place used by bats for shelter, whether they are present or not. If bats are discovered on site development shall cease and the applicant is advised to contact Natural England for advice.

NOTE: Electric Vehicle Charging Points

- A Standard electric vehicle charging point is one which is capable of providing a continuous supply of at least 16A (3.5kW). A 32A (7kW) is however more likely to be futureproof
- Standard charging points for single residential properties that meet the requirements specified in the latest version of "Minimum technical specification - Electric Vehicle Homecharge Scheme (EVHS)" by the Office for Low Emission Vehicles will be acceptable. Basically, charging points that provide Mode 3 charging with a continuous output of least 16A (3.5kW) and have Type 2 sockets would be acceptable.
- The electrical supply of the final installation should allow the charging equipment to operate at full rated capacity.
- The installation must comply with all applicable electrical requirements in force at the time of installation.

Pursuant to article 35 (2) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2015 and guidance in the National Planning Policy Framework, the Local Planning Authority have, where possible, made a pre-application advice service available, complied with the Kirklees Development Management Charter 2015 and otherwise actively engaged with the applicant in dealing with the application. In this instance, officers entered into discussions with the applicant and agent regarding the design of the dwellings and the proposed roofing materials. As such, amended plans were sought on the 1st and 20th of September in order to overcome the above concerns. A phase 1 contaminated land report has also been submitted and reviewed by Environmental Health Officers.

Digital Infrastructure: Fibre To The Property (FTTP)

Access to affordable and reliable broadband is necessary for Kirklees' residents, businesses, and visitors to take advantage of the growing digital economy and 'digital by default' services. Fibre optic cables direct to a property (FTTP) is the most reliable way of delivering high speed broadband connectivity and allows for gigabit internet speeds. Access to high quality digital infrastructure provides the foundations for, amongst other things:

- Economic prosperity – workforces that are digitally-literate enables business to thrive.
- Digital literacy – digital literacy and skills increase employability and people can exploit the internet for transactional, social, entertainment and learning purposes.
- New services – digital delivery can lower costs and provide innovative public and health services more conveniently.

It is therefore advised that digital infrastructure, including FTTP, and its benefits for the development be considered from the earliest feasible stage.

Methods include working with Internet Service Providers to install digital infrastructure alongside other utilities or providing pre-infrastructure allowing for speeder installation at a later date.

Note: The provision of fibre infrastructure is often available from certain telecommunications providers free of charge for development over a certain scale, provided that sufficient notice is given. Notice periods are typically at least 12 months prior to first occupation. In some cases, providers may request a contribution from the developer.

Note: Where no telecommunications provider has been secured to provide fibre infrastructure by the time of highway construction, it is advised that additional dedicated telecommunications ducting is incorporated alongside other utilities to enable the efficient and cost-effective provision of fibre infrastructure in the future.

Building Regulations Approval is required for most work involving building operations and/or structural alterations. It is the applicant's responsibility to find out if the work permitted by this planning permission needs approval under the Building Regulations, and if necessary to submit an application. Details Reserved by Condition

- This permission has been granted subject to conditions. Some of the conditions may require you to submit further details. These conditions normally contain the wording “submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority”.
- You can apply online for approval of these details at the Planning Portals website at www.planningportal.gov.uk. Alternatively the forms and supporting guidance for submitting an application can be found online at www.kirklees.gov.uk/planning.
- This Authority recognises the need to ensure that you are able to develop the site as effectively and flexibly as possible. However, at the same time it must ensure that development is in accordance with the terms of the planning conditions and legal agreement and the expectations of elected members and local residents set through the decision process.
- You should note the triggers for compliance with the conditions of this planning permission. This Authority is committed to processing applications to discharge conditions in a timely manner. It is important to ensure that submissions are made as far in advance of the trigger to allow time for adequate consultation, discussion and in some circumstances publicity.
- It is important that applications to discharge conditions are accompanied by sufficient information to enable this Authority and its consultees to fully consider and determine the proposals. Whilst officers will endeavour to negotiate solutions, failure to provide a comprehensive submission may result in delay and refusal of the application.
- If you commence work without discharging conditions you are at risk of enforcement action and invalidating your permission if the planning condition is a pre commencement condition.

Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your Local Planning Authority to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- If an enforcement notice is served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against your Local Planning Authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within:
 - i) 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice, or
 - ii) within the specified period, starting on the date of this notice,whichever period expires earlier.
- If you want to appeal against your Local Planning Authority's decision then you must do so within the specified period, starting on the date of this notice.
- The "specified period" is 12 weeks where the development relates to a "minor commercial application" as defined within the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2010 (as amended), or 6 months in any other case.
- Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or online at <https://www.gov.uk/planning-inspectorate> . Further information on the Planning Appeal process can be found online at the Planning Inspectorates website <https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/planning-inspectorate>.
- You must use the correct Planning Appeal Form when making your appeal. If requesting forms from the Planning Inspectorate, please state the type of application that the appeal relates to so they can send you the appeal form you require.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the Local Planning Authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.
- In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based their decision on a direction given by him.

Please note, only the applicant possesses the right of appeal.

Purchase Notices

- If either the Local Planning Authority or the Secretary of State refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.

In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council. This notice will require the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
