



KEY TO BOUNDARY TREATMENT

SOFT LANDSCAPING BOUNDARY TREATMENT - REFER TO LANDSCAPE ARCHITECT'S SCHEME

- - - - - Existing vegetation retained at boundary
- Native hedgerow
- Formal hedgerow
- - - - - Ornamental shrubs & planting at boundary

Boundary planting shown indicatively refer to landscape architect's scheme

HARD LANDSCAPING BOUNDARY TREATMENT - REFER TO BOUNDARY TREATMENT DETAILS, DRWG. NO. 10703-SELF-P-XX-A-020

- - - - - Existing railings to site boundary retained
- - - - - New painted metal railings - 1000mm high
- - - - - Close boarded timber fence to rear gardens - 1800mm high
- - - - - Retaining wall nominally 1200mm above ground level, depending on location close boarded timber fence over min. 600mm, to a total height of 1800mm
- - - - - Artstone faced retaining walls & artstone masonry enclosures to bins. Heights vary but generally 1200mm above ground level on higher side
- Timber post and rail fencing within plots 1 & 62, 900mm high
