The proposed development seeks prior approval for the change of use from Class E (commercial) to Class C3(a) residential. The change of use will consist of 3 flats, one 2b3p flat and two 1b1p flat. It will also consists installation of new doors and windows to the front and rear elevation and velux roof window of the attic floor.

All internal walls, ceilings and party walls will be treated with building control approved sound insulation and soundblock plasterboards. New windows and doors to be fitted with glazing as follows - 8mm laminated glass, 16mm Argon filled cavity - 4 Glass, windows installed with acoustic tricklevents.

The site is not listed however it lies within the Dewsbury Conservation Area which was designated in March 1981. The buildings within the Conservation Area contains buildings that were constructed pre-1939. The ground floor which is subject of this application is and is currently within E use and our proposals are for the change of use which includes changes to the frontage.

The building consists of a natural slate roof. The frontage consists of stone and softwood windows and doors and shopfront. The conservation area has a mixture of stone and renders which produces less consistent elevations than what's usually found within a conservation area.

The property has a positive contribution to the area and it's our intention that the proposed alterations also reflect this positive contribution.

We intend to respect the conservation area whilst at the same time making sympathetic alterations to accommodate the change of use.

We feel that there will be minimal impact on the conservation area and there will be external alterations that are in keeping with the street scene. We intend to use natural materials in particular ashlar stone and timber.

A good example would be the buildings on the same street which the ground floor has been successfully converted and the replacement of shop front with natural stone walling and timber doors have a positive contribution to the conservation area. The design and the use of natural materials would preserve and enhance the property within the conservation area. We feel that the alterations play a key part in securing optimum viable use for the heritage asset in the interests of long term conservation there are minimum alternatives as the area is currently in decline and evidence that existing shops along Daisy Hill are being converted to residential is an indication of optimum viable use is being considered.
