Good morning,

I have submitted several appeals at the above site, and I wanted to provide you with an update which might have an impact on these appeals.

Yesterday I was passing the site and so I called in to have a look at the trees etc. The site has now been developed and it appears as though the land has now been divided in ownership between the several properties that now exist there. I do not know who owns what property, land or trees.

Also, I am aware that additional evidence is not accepted at this stage of the appeals process, but I thought it might be relevant to let you know that trees T2 and T3 are now almost completely dead from what appears to be ash die-back disease. I have attached two photos which show this.

I have copied Kirklees council into this email - if they are happy for trees T2 and T3 (as labelled in the application) to be removed under an exemption then this will negate the need for any appeal, so I would therefore request that this email be taken as a 'five day notice' of intention to remove dangerous trees under exemption from the need to make an application. If Kirklees is happy with this, then I would be happy to contact the local residents directly affected by these trees in order to inform them that the trees can be removed under exemption. This outcome would adequately address my concerns regarding the health and safety of local residents.
