I wish to voice my objection to these proposed plans. I have lived on

6 years and in that time there has been constant building work going on.

Houses at the top of the cul de sac houses on the old playing area old nursery and huge houses above there. With the latest houses, residents on this side had rats in their gardens due to work on the pipe layout. No rats had ever been seen there before.

It has been constant noise dirt and disruption I work from home and this has resulted in Zoom meetings cutting out regularly when diggers were carrying out the most recent building work.

We have an abundance of wildlife here including bats owls and foxes It is a haven for them. Destruction of yet more green areas is shocking and heartbreaking to comprehend. We should be protecting fauna and flora, rather than tearing it down for more homes. The fields at the top contain wild flowers and grass - they attract bees, butterflies and other species The natural environment will be decimated further We should be planting trees and wild flower areas, not destroying them to put tarmac in.

When we have heavy rain, it often floods down the hill. Without the fields to absorb this excess water the results could prove dangerous for the main road The old mineworks I don't believe would be safe either.

I also worry about the infrastructure - local schools are already full. The added traffic will be unsafe especially on the road opposite the church

We just cannot cope with more houses in the area.

We are told that houses will be affordable but the most recent builds have been between £300,000 and £800,000.

I have to wonder, what future generations will think of this vandalism of our village.
