Subsequent to my email of 5 February 2023 I enclose the original hard copies of the neighbourhood petition objecting to the above planning application, and the letter from my neighbour,

We object to planning application number 2023/90052 on the grounds that the positioning of a 5g mast at the proposed site on Wood Lane, Longley is wholly inappropriate. The application should be rejected because:

- The erection of the mast will create an intrusive and overbearing feature and have a serious detrimental effect at a prominent location within the street scene.
- The siting and appearance of the mast will be harmful to the character and setting of the Grade II* listed Longley Old Hall, the surrounding listed properties, particularly 177-179 Longley, 191 Longley and 197-201 Longley and other residential properties which will be adversely affected by the close proximity of the mast.
- The proposed position, within a few metres of grade II* Longley Old Hall, the oldest house in Huddersfield and an important heritage asset, is inconsistent with
 - paragraph 200 of the *National Planning Policy Framework* (2021)
 - paragraph 61 of the *Code of Practice for Wireless Network Development in England* – advice from Historic England has not been sought as is required for applications affecting grade II* listed buildings
 - Kirklees Council's guidance on planning and development – no heritage statement has been included in the application as is advised by the Council when a planning application affects a heritage asset.
