We OBJECT to the above planning application on the following grounds:

We have a private garden that is fenced all the way around with locked gates but with this application they have eight windows that will take away privacy from within our house, the windows are facing directly into our garden and straight into our living room and a bedroom upstairs with only 3 metres in between their windows and ours which we are not comfortable with as we have four children aged 16, 15, 12, 7 who are usually playing in the garden.

As a family we like to sit in the garden as most of us suffer from vitamin D deficiency, so we have to make the most of sitting out in the sun.

As they are making flats and two retail shops all the windows will be different tenants which makes it even worse, we won't know who is looking into our house and garden or making the mess.

We will not give permission to anything after 10pm regarding the retail shops as our children go to bed at 8pm.

They have added two new windows which are very low down which is high a hazard as the kids play football in the garden with their friends so there will be more of a chance of them windows breaking.

Also depending on who's going to be living there they could be throwing rubbish directly into our garden as previously we used to find cigarette docks, used syringes, needles, empty drugs bags and condoms amongst other rubbish in our garden which is very dangerous as our kids are under sixteen.

My neighbour who lives one door up was also complaining saying the windows on the top two floors will be overlooking into their private garden space as well, which she is not happy about as she likes to have her garden barbecues/parties.

Our only objection is regarding the windows that are overlooking into our garden and facing directly opposite our living room and bedroom window which are only three metres apart, if they can remove these from the planning application then we would appreciate that.
