



I object to this planning application as it is proposed to be squeezed onto a small area of land, which will mean several houses will now lose their view and be overlooked. I've just moved to the area and live just off of Halifax road, an already busy road that doesn't need an additional 200 cars.

The local school is nearby and it's already busy, cars parked on all sides of the road it doesn't need more. It is oversubscribed, as are doctors, dentists etc. the infrastructure simply isn't here to sustain 77 families, because 77 homes realistically is almost 300 more people if each house had 4 occupants (I know they won't all but with families and couples etc).

Currently we walk our dog near this proposed piece of land and it is idyllic and peaceful and feels like a lovely bit of countryside. There's wildlife and trees which will be wiped out if a housing development is agreed. It will entirely change the landscape, the feel of the area and ruin a really lovely place. I've moved here recently because I wanted the peace and this will entirely disrupt that.

I commute through Heckmondwike to get to Dewsbury train station and the traffic is awful on a morning. This will only serve to exacerbate the issue of an already overpopulated area. I know more houses are required but they should be built with new infrastructure, shops schools and GPs to service the new development but this is simply shoehorning extra homes into somewhere that they aren't wanted and don't fit. You only have to look at the long list of comments to see how upset and angry people will be about it. I've also noticed the planning application originally said 67 homes and 145 cars, now it's 77 and 200 cars, why the increase? I think this would really reduce the appeal of Liversedge and add unnecessary pressure to everything. I don't think any real thought has been put into this other than seeing a piece of land rather than bigger picture for the area.
