The increase in HGVs using this road to and from the quarry will impact negatively on residents, horse riders, cyclists and hikers using this area, specifically for its beautiful unspoilt views and peacefulness. I moved here myself to be in more open, green and quiet space, and being an NHS shift worker, this is very important to my overall well-being, i.e. being able to sleep and rest for normal function and safe practice at work. I'm certain my neighbours moved here and value this area as it is now with similar reasons for their own families. Considering what all leading authorities should have learned from the pandemic too, it would be very disappointing if there was no priority on conserving countryside areas and wildlife. The whole character of this area would be destroyed by the noise, disturbance and fumes that affect air quality. The 5 lanes junction at Lane Top which we overlook is already hazardous and noisy at times from passing motorbikes and cars not adhering to safe speed limits particularly when approaching the several bends on this lane which leads over to Crow Edge. The increased potential of accidents and any impact by a car, cycle, horse or children in the area with a heavier vehicle is very concerning (consider impact on highway safety). Tractors and horse boxes do not cause a nuisance as they are synonymous with country life, and to be expected, but an increased volume of traffic - particularly HGVs - would hinder these farm vehicles too no doubt when trying to complete their daily work. I appreciate businesses need to evolve or expand but there needs to be more consideration on alternative sites or other routes at least so that we can preserve what beautiful countryside areas we have and avoid the negative impact this will have on people and properties in this area.
