The proposed development would have a major impact on the natural environment. The trees and hedges in that locality are a large part of the local character yet are not important to the local landscape according to the applicant. However I can assure the Council they are important to the local community. Such a large scale development will I believe have a terrible effect on the local wildlife which is an integral part of this semi-rural area. I note the proposed working hours of the site are 7.00am to 6pm on Monday to Fridays and 7.30am to 1pm on Saturdays so the increased traffic, dust and pollution resulting from heavy goods vehicles (one every 6 minutes or so) will be hugely detrimental for the area. In addition by using the access road for the household waste site will cause a build up of traffic at that junction on an access road that isn't really wide enough for two cars never mind heavily laden HGV's. The local road network isn't designed for a massive increase in HGV's. How will this massive increase in traffic get to Wavin's works at Crow Edge. The junction at the sovereign crossroads isn't designed for HGV's to turn left onto the A629 and using Carr Hill Road would mean travelling through a large part of Cumberworth creating noise and pollution for those residents for the vast majority of each and every week for years. With the drive on for net zero carbon how does this proposal for 100 plus HGV's and associated excavation plant to be operating in this semi rural area fit in with that goal. I cannot see any benefits his proposal will bring to the area. Instead only noise, filth, pollution, devastation of local wildlife and a scar on the landscape for the next 25 years.
