Re. New Quarry, Bromley Farm
Upper Cumberworth.

I wish to object to the proposed quarrying activities at Bromley Farm Quarry for the following reasons:-

1. If the existing entrance to the Council tip off the A635 is to be used by numerous HGVs as well as cars visiting the tip, there will be serious congestion bearing in mind the amount of traffic using this road - going and coming to work.
2. Most of the children at Cumberworth School come in cars and already there is quite a lot of congestion before the start and finish of School.
3. There is bound to be considerable noise pollution both in the quarry and on local roads.
4. During adverse weather conditions dirt and slurry could be carried into Barnsley Road, as the road from the existing quarry slopes very steeply and water collects onto Barnsley Road and runs down to Denby Dale.

5. Lumberworth is only a small village and lots of the residents enjoy walking their dogs in the local woods but have to cross Barnsley Road which could become quite hazardous especially when accompanied by small children.
6. The close proximity of the proposed development to the estate is bound to have an adverse effect on house prices. Many of the residents on the estate have lived in these houses for over fifty five years, when they were first erected, and are now quite elderly. They do not need the upset and inconvenience

It appears that there will be no benefit to the Village and it would have been helpful if the Local Authority could have notified Residents of this proposal. There are still a lot of people who are not "on line" and had it not been for would not be aware of what might happen.
