We wish to object against the following planning application as feel that it is detrimental to the surrounding area. We already have a significant amount of HGV traffic utilising country lanes and roads that were not designed for this kind of heavy traffic. The increased traffic represents a direct risk to walkers, horse riders, cyclists and people who simply want to enjoy the surrounding countryside. Our property is on Haddingley Lane, which already has a high volume of HGVs (many being from Plevin/Wavin) which dangerously thunder past our home. On numerous occasions, metal components from the wagons have ended up in our garden which could have resulted in serious injury or death. This was reported on more than one occasion to both the Police and company and nothing was done about it. Many of the dry stone walls along the roadside have also suffered as a result which are extremely costly to repair and should not be our responsibility. We have an abundance of wildlife in this area which will also be affected by the huge increase in traffic which is unacceptable. The volume and frequency of the wagons would mean a constant flow of noisy, dusty, dangerous and disruptive vehicles on narrow and unsuitable roads. The surrounding village and properties have had enough. This appears to be an application for the financial gain of just one person with no consideration as to the suitability or how it will affect hundreds of properties in the locality. We strongly recommend that you reject this application based on the above points and consider the lives of the residents of Denby Dale, Upper/Lower Cumberworth and surrounding areas.
