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Dear Sir/Madam,

Thank you for your email dated 4th Feb 2025 giving details of the current position on this application. In addition to my original objection to this development, I should like to raise the following concerns and queries.

1 It is still not clear what type of vehicles will be used (tippers/ articulated?) or the number of trips in and out of the site both for the excavated materials and for the infill loads.

2 The type of vehicle is significant for accessing and leaving the site (turning distances/sight lines for cyclists and pedestrians) and also for potential hazards and hold ups at junctions at the Sovereign crossroads and in New Mill.

3 Current volumes of traffic on local rural roads and on A roads is too heavy and too fast without the addition of what would appear to be in the region of one hundred plus HGVs per day.

4 Regarding adaptations to the site entrance which at present is relatively unobtrusive, I think residents need to know what changes are being planned and they should have the opportunity to have their ideas and input considered before this application is considered.

5 In view of the recent judgement regarding the environmental damage caused by the end use of extracted materials and the intense energy needs in the manufacturing of clay products, I do not believe there are justifiable grounds for continuing with this planning application.

6 As I said in my previous objection to this plan, the well being and safety of local residents are being forfeited for precious little gain (if any) for the people of the UK.

Finally, the 14 day time limit for responding to such a potentially major new (NB not an extension) development is unreasonable and is hardly in the spirit of local democracy.
