The property currently falls in category C3 (Dwellinghouse) and was used as a residential home by tenants. The property does not require planning permission as the proposed change of use will not differentiate from a normal house, as our aim is to provide a loving and caring home as a normal home would be. The proposed change of use falls into category of Class C2 (residential institution) which is why we are submitting this application as it can not be an automatic permitted change.

Why do you consider that a Lawful Development Certificate should be granted for this proposal?

We believe this proposed change of use will be beneficial to children who are in need of a loving and caring environment to which they might not receive currently. By granting us lawful development it will allow us to provide these children with many benefits which will support them to develop into young adults with many opportunities. Children with certain behavioural problems need a stable and steady environment with the correct resources to allow them to manage their behaviours. Unfortunately some children do not receive this type of supportive environment whatever the reason may be, and we want to provide a safe place for them. This is a necessary service and it is crucial that this type of support is available for local authorities to fulfill their legal obligation to provide a safe environment for young children to receive this type of support.

This service intends to provide support to children between 16-18 years of age on a long term basis. Monthly visits by social workers will be made to this property, however we do not expect any other external visitors. Support will be provided by qualified carers who will be appropriately trained, and only in rare and extreme cases do we expect external professions such as therapists to visit. Children will be expected to attend school and no tuition is expected to take place at this location, and in an event of waiting periods to attend school then children will attend temporary tuition in another location such as a library.

To conclude, the property will be used as a residential property for up to two young people to live there as a safe environment and equivalent to a typical family home, as well as this they will have their own bedroom as a permanent residence to which they feel is their own space. We intend to create opportunities and encourage them to make the best choices for themselves. The atmosphere we intend to create will be the same as a typical loving family home, to which they may not have previously received. There will be no disturbances to neighbours as we do not expect many visitors that differentiates to a normal family home. We believe that there is sufficient car parking facilities for staff as there is a drive which has room for two cars as well as street parking in front of the house, therefore this will not affect the neighbours.

Finally we would be grateful if the local authority consider to grant lawful use to our proposal as this is a necessary service for young people in need.
