I'm father of two children that currently study Islamic education at Mohaddis-E-Azam Mission on Ravenshouse Rd. I am in full support of the Mosque to receive the planning permission to construct a larger centre for all students. My kids have improved so much over the past over the past four years. My kids have gained a lot of religious knowledge on how Islam teaches to become a good human being and to look after everyone. I have read some of the negative comments that are predominantly objecting the planning due to parking. There is nothing that is a concern, there are mosque committee and volunteers who are always out between the start of classes and end of classes to ensure the kids are safe until parents have picked them up. They have a one way system in the car park, whereby the parents drop and pick their kids up. The volunteer ensures to give stop and go signals for the car drivers coming out of the Mosque car park to make sure it's clear for them to drive. At the Friday prayers, there is always a committee member present to ensure all worshippers are parked correctly and aren't blocking anyone's drives or parked in a tight space that could lead to congestion. Most people walk to the mosque who live nearby. I myself reside in Westtown opposite the Markazi Mosque on High Street, my street is rammed to brim with cars and I sometimes find it difficult to get park my car due to the lack of space. They have a car park that's way bigger and yet people decide to use the streets and nothing gets said or done about that. It's Friday prayers, people are in no more than 30 mins approx and are on their way. My kids are very happy and always look forward to going to the Mosque on Ravenshouse Road. A lot of these negative comments are simply because the mosque
