This Design and Access Statement has been prepared on behalf of Cashzone in support of an application submitted for:

The Installation of an Automated Teller Machine and signage

Appearance

We are proposing to install an ATM to the right-hand side set back from the main entrance at the Co-operative Food Store. The ATM will be installed through a 12mm Grey Laminated Alu-glaze panel as a through the laminate installation.

The property is situated within a mainly commercial accommodation, we consider that the installation of this ATM would not be detrimental to the existing street scene. The site is not a listed building.

Use

The purpose of the installation of this Automated Teller Machine is to provide a 24 hour banking facility for the local community and visitors to the area.

Scale

Layout

The installation of the ATM has not altered the basic design of the building. Our proposal includes the removal of 2 existing glazed panels, and a composite mid-rail section and installation of a laminate Alu-glaze panel. The colour of this panel is Grey and was chosen to best blend with the existing shop front design. Panels are 12mm thick comprising of 1.2mm powder coated aluminium bonded to either side of a Ravatherm core (see attached data sheet).

Amount

This is not a new structure, but the installation of an ATM in an existing shop.

Landscaping

Due to the nature of the proposal, we feel the application will not benefit from any landscaping.

Design Principals

The ATM is of standard design as located in many areas throughout the UK and is accepted as a necessary facility. There are a number of mandatory standards which apply, relating to the position of the ATM, its visibility, ambient lighting, building structure, building security features, ATM anchoring, safe strength.

Designing out Crime

We install and anchor the ATMs in accordance with National Guidelines.

Site approval by the Cash In Transit Company has been obtained. They have considered routes to and from the ATM, ensuring there is protection of their staff and of any staff or customers at the site. Paramount in their review has been the welfare of their staff and the persons they come into contact with.

The area where the ATM has been installed is in a well-lit open area in full view of pedestrians aiding natural surveillance. There is existing CCTV covering the shopfront.

Access

The access to the site and other properties has not been affected. In designing this application, we have taken into account the needs of able and disabled users. The ATM is set at a height that makes it accessible for all users and has space to the front for a wheel chair. Key 5 has raised markings for blind persons to identify the centre key.
