I was only made aware of this improvement scheme on our local FB group today.

I object to the access from Green Lane onto the Greenway being widened as we have enough social disturbances on there.

I want to be able to walk in peace there or cycle without having to negotiate motorised vehicles such as quads and motorbikes coming from behind or from in front. Green Lane is a notorious location for dumping of and sometimes scrap etc so widening that access and possibly widening the tarmac path would encourage more of that kind of behaviour or torching stolen vehicles. Widening the Greenway

If the widening is to allow for bikes to have their own lanes then I'm cautiously okay with that but if it isn't then we need the grass verges to step out of the way

I'm pleased if the resurfacing will solve the roots trying to break to the surface in search of water.

Vegetation

Hoping no vegetation needs removing, but that if you're adding it'll be more appropriate for wildlife than things like laurels and that you will use Beardsworths for local sourcing. Some more fruit trees/bushes will be nice in the areas that don't have industry.

The area near Oakenshaw bridge that is a Marsh has Irises (or did) - will they be kept there or are they not considered worth keeping. If so please don't throw away, I can relocate.

I use it frequently on a Wednesday with a small group of _____ and we do wish we didn't have to keep shouting out "Poo" to make sure those less sure footed don't step in dog muck. Hope extra signage and adequate bin provision is being considered.
