### **Assessment**

The application seeks permission for a two storey side extension and open canopy roof to southeast and southwest elevation.

#### **Extension:**

Pitch roofed with roof lights over two storeys, with small single-storey projection a ground with lean-to roof:

- ~7.5m roof ridge height & ~6.2m eaves height from ground at two storeys
- ~4m roof ridge height & ~3.5m eaves height from ground at single-storey
- ~3m projection from side at both storeys
- ~3.9m depth at ground; ~2.8m depth at first floor

*Officer Note:* Plans show height from hardsurface hence the modest variation from annotated plans to description.

Windows front and rear (all obscure glazed apart from rear elevation ground floor window). Clad in natural stone with dark slate tile to match host.

#### **Open canopy roof:**

- ~4m ridge height x ~3.5m height from ground
- Projecting a range of 1.15-1.5m from the elevation

Roofed in dark slate tile. Green Oak posts.

**Alterations:**

Conversion of ground floor Window to patio door on northeast elevation.  
 Addition of first storey window to original side projection

**Design and Visual Amenity:**

Streetscene consists of large semi-detached or detached properties with a mix of styles/materials and organic additions to the original in large grounds. Generally characterised as pleasant, leafy and residential area. Natural stone a dominant material used in streetscene to properties and boundary treatments.

Consideration has been given here in terms of the proposals impact on the local character and street scene, including subservience, terracing and building line.

### Residential Amenity:

The main properties affected are:

- No. 27 Woodside Road (set close to highway and not directly adjacent to the host). This has no side elevation windows to be affected. The proposed extension would remove windows facing this neighbour's garden with an improved relationship with privacy.

3. The external wall materials of the extension and the roofing materials of the canopy and extension hereby approved shall in all respects match those used in the construction of the existing building and be retained thereafter.

**Reason:** In the interests of visual amenity and in accordance with Policies LP01, LP02 & LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Key Design Principles 1 and 2 of the Council's adopted House Extensions and Alterations Supplementary Planning Document and policies within Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

**NOTE:** Should any bats be found during the development, then work must cease immediately, and the advice of a licensed bat worker sought.
