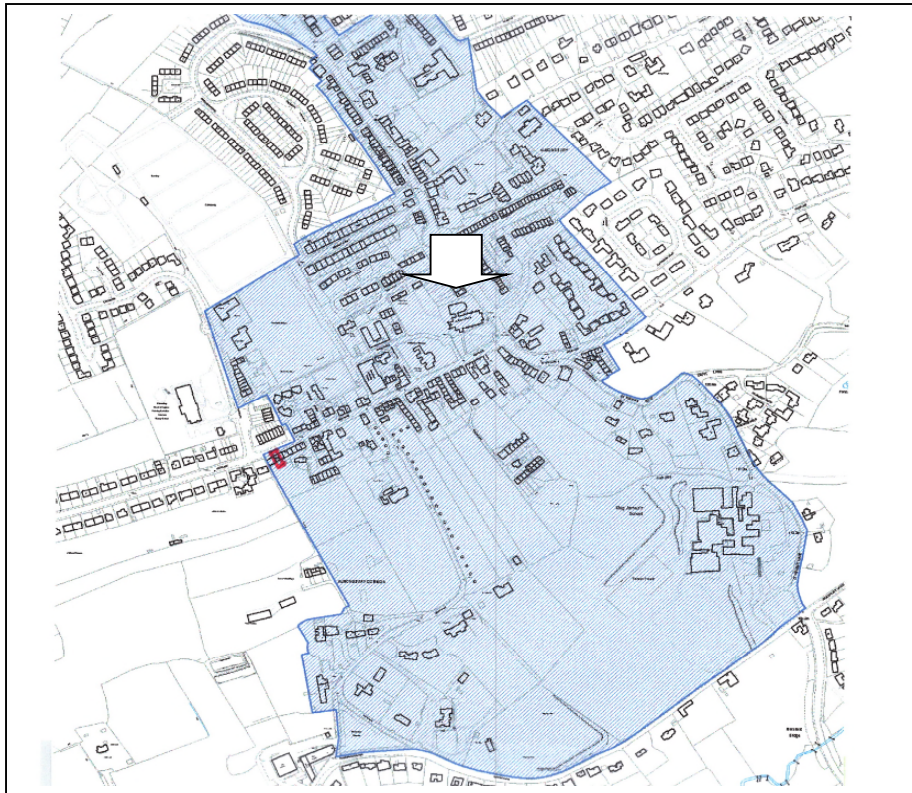
Introduction and Planning History

The cottage is situated in a row of similar stone built dwellings along Northgate.

There are a number of listed buildings in the Almondbury area.

The Almondbury Conservation Area

There is no appraisal but the area is included below with the site marked by the arrow. It is next door to the extension to the 'Church of All Hallows on the corner.

Although the Church is listed grade I the extension is not and the nearest listings associated with the church are the gate one side and the wall and gate the other.

There are other listed building in the area but well away from the church and the cottage.

The Proposal

The cottage is partly set into the sloping site and the previous rear single storey extension only has a velux window to provide light and comprises a small kitchen. The intention is to form a new first floor Kitchen/Dining Room at first floor level, with access from the existing staircase and doors onto a new terrace at garden level. This will take advantage of the afternoon and evening sunshine which is very restricted at present.

Design

The extension will be constructed in matching masonry with a pitched slate roof in line and continuous with the existing cottage.

The adjacent cottage has been purchased and the existing flag roofed store which presently extends into the cottage site is to be removed and the new building constructed forming a void below the new extension.

Glazed doors will lead onto a flagged terrace at garden level which will be level with that existing and the side windows on the car space side will match those on this elevation.

SCALE and ACCESS

The scale and appearance is indicated on the submission drawings and is sympathetic to the appearance and proportion of the adjoining buildings .

The extension being of a similar character to the existing will be in keeping with the appearance and style of the cottages and will respect the heritage aspect of the church building and it's extension.

Boundary treatments are unchanged and there will be no works adjacent to the church walls.

POLICY

All development should be of good quality design and contribute to the built environment.

Proposals should respect the architectural qualities of surrounding buildings and their materials of construction, and contribute to the preservation or enhancement of the character or appearance of the area and in this case the proximity of the listed cottages.
