LISTED BUILDING CONSENT FOR RENOVATION OF OUTBUILDING AND ERECTION OF GLAZED LEAN-TO ON THE SOUTH EAST ELEVATION OF THE OUTBUILDING TO FORM DOMESTIC WORKSHOP FOR USES INCIDENTAL TO THE ENJOYMENT OF THE DWELLINGHOUSE

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**In accordance with the plan(s) and applications submitted to the Council on 08-Apr-2024 subject to the condition(s) specified hereunder:-**

1. The development shall be begun within three years of the date in which this consent is granted.

**Reason:** Pursuant to Section 18(1) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, as amended by Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

**Reason:** For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and so as to ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, and to accord with Policies LP2, LP24 and LP35 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Policies within Chapters 2, 12 and 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

3. No use of friction or egress hinges shall be permitted on any of the windows.

**Reason:** To ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, in the interests of the significance of the heritage and to accord within Kirklees Local Plan Policy LP35 and policies within Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

4. The window shall make use of traditional window stays and closers.

**Reason:** To ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, in the interests of the significance of the heritage and to accord within Kirklees Local Plan Policy LP35 and policies within Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

5. The thickness of any double glazing units in the windows or doors are to have a thickness of no more than 16mm.

**Reason:** To ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, in the interests of the significance of the heritage and to accord within Kirklees Local Plan Policy LP35 and policies within Chapter 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

Following clarification regarding a window being a top opening casement, Officer have accepted the amendments as being acceptable. The final set of amended plans were received on 10th June 2024 and form the basis of this assessment.
