<p>I am very unhappy about the proposal to construct 50 new dwellings. To begin with being disabled</p> <p>The traffic is already problematic and at rush hour Shepley rd is dangerous when I go walking . The addition of 50 new homes with the entrance onto Shepley rd will significantly increase the Hazard and would further limit my oppurtunities for exercise. To suggest as the application states that there will only be a small addition number of vehicles is nonsense . There will be an additional 100 or so vehicles in the new development and as there is no work in the village a significant number of people will need to travel as do most of the current village members. Some might work from home BUT there will be very few. The road to Shepley is already congested at rush hour and a share of the 100 extra vehicles will seriously exaccerbate it.</p> <p>Stocksmoor is a lovely village with an abundance of nature. the woods are a place of special beauty in spring with bluebells and other flora. There are many species of birds eg Green woodpeckers , treecreepers and other animals eg Foxes. The site proposed has been a Badger Run for a number of years and there are species of Bats in surrounding area. The proposals do not make any contribution to protecting and maintaining the balance of nature.</p> <p>Currently there are about 170-180 houses and there is a strong community spirit with people helping each other especially assising elderly and infirm members. . There have been several developments over the years each small enough to assimilate into the community. This proposal will add one third more houses and this will seriously dilute the community.</p>
