<p>I strongly object to the building of 50 houses on the site in Stocksmoor. There are a number of reasons which form the basis of my objection.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Access - the proposed access to the site is on a dangerous blind bend. There have unfortunately been a number of accidents in this road as it is single track and the increased amount of traffic will cause more accidents. To have access on a blind bend seems ludicrous to me.• Amenities - we do not have accessible amenities in Stocksmoor - doctors, shops. The nearest amenities are in Shepley which would mean more traffic on the roads and especially on Shepley Road where the proposed access would be. I have to travel down this road to work and have witnessed various accidents on this single track road. I worry about walkers (no pavement), cars, tractors, cyclists and horse riders which all use this stretch of road on a daily basis. Having more traffic on these unsuitable roads causes danger for our children too.• Schools - the school in our catchment is Thurstonland First School. It's a tiny village school with two year groups per class. Building more houses will cause the local schools (some which are already oversubscribed in various year groups) to become even more oversubscribed. I believe Thurstonland First School is land locked so can't be made any bigger. This would mean children being unable to get into their local schools.• Transport links - we already have limited transport links in the village which again means more people having to use cars to get around. Building 50 houses would cause at least 100 more cars driving through the village.• Disproportionate amount of houses - there are 180 houses already in Stocksmoor. Building another 50 houses would cause the village to grow by another 30%.• Roads - the roads leading into and out of Stocksmoor all provide inadequate entry and exit points. More vehicles on these roads would surely mean more accidents.
