To whomever it may concern,

I am writing to announce my objections to the proposed building in Stocksmoor.

This proposed building will have severe detrimental effects on the surrounding environment, mental well-being, and road access for those who live in the surrounding area. In a time where all councils are being criticized for not reducing or bettering their carbon emissions, this planning is a direct show from the council that they have no interest in pioneering the way for a better future for the younger generations. As someone who grew up in Stockmoor with many of my childhood memories being based around the area where building is proposed, I reject the idea that future generations will be deprived of living in an area with thriving and educational ecosystems that will support their future.

Furthermore, if you are willing to overlook the damage that will be caused to the surrounding area, the idea of this industrialization lacks organization. Stocksmoor is a village surrounded by narrow country roads that are not built to sustain the volume of traffic that will be directly caused by the building works and the subsequent increase in the volume of people that live in the village. Most of the people that will move to the village will have cars, as the current public transport system leaves something to be desired, these roads cannot support this. This unsupported increase in traffic has the possibility of increasing road traffic accidents and a lower level of safety in this previously tranquil village.

I find the proposal both lazy and abhorrent, I cannot view this building proposal as anything other than a money-making exercise that demonstrates the council's lack of care for its constituents. The suggestion is that this building will allow for an increase in affordable housing for future generations. However, I cannot believe this, as demonstrated by the buildings for Stockmead, which showed to me as a young person that once again the council was not planning this building work as possible betterment for my future but to gain more for themselves, or at least this is how it came across to me.

For the council to ignore or reject these claims and objections to this planning would further support this argument and demonstrate the lack of care that I have seen demonstrated by the council time and time again throughout my entire life living in this area.
