

Yet again harron homes are trying to get this application changed.

As far as I am aware there is still a case for part of this land and who actually owns it, they cannot build on land that they do not own.

I have heard that they want access via Brookfield view, this was not mentioned in the planning and should not be allowed, Balme road is not suitable for heavy vehicles, neither are Brookfield view, or Kilroy drive.

The playground and picnic area stated is a red flag for anti-social behaviour and drug taking, it's bad enough already in Cleckheaton.

Another point is that this development could take up to 9 years to build, how can you expect residents to put up with this for so long.

A lot of work from home now so the endless noise for workmen and vehicles arriving early and leaving late, which will happen no matter what restrictions you put in which will affect them mentally.

There are loads of developments taking place in Cleckheaton and green space is being eroded by these endless developments and will affect people's mental health if even more open space is taken away because of this ridiculous development.
