<p>I would like to object to the recent planning application, by Holmfirth tech. They are wanting to remove conditions that have been put in place to keep people safe. I live in one of the terrace houses, next to the tech car park. I have private land, at the end of my garden, which is used for parking.</p> <p>We used to park around the corner, out of the way. We were asked to either, start paying money to park or move our car. We moved our car. By doing so, it has made the access to the Tech's main car park very narrow and our car very prone to been bumped. Our car has been damaged by people visiting the Tech a couple of times. On occasion, a Tech visitor would park in the small area, in such a manner as to block the access to the larger car park. This, obviously, causes a lot of distress for people who are blocked in. It just seems a very insensible arrangement.</p> <p>Holmfirth Tech have invested in" Flash Park" parking signs. They are to warn, that unpermitted parked cars will be fined £100. I have only ever known of the Tech using these signs to threaten residents. Anyone and everybody (apart from the residents and their visitors) are allowed to park in the car park, with or without a permit, whether they are accessing the Tech or not. They did just that, yesterday, for the duck race.</p> <p>I feel that this money could have been better spent on safety signs. There are no warnings to look out for children, for example, when exiting/entering the car park. There could be signs on the pavement to warn pedestrians of a concealed entrance. There could be signs warning of a trip hazard, on the bumpy car park. Safety seems to have been very much overlooked.</p> <p>There is one particular tree, at the back of my property. Its roots have damaged the tarmac and a pillar, supporting a stone wall. The wall has a lamp post attached to it. The wall looks in danger of falling down. I am worried that the post will fall and damage my property. It could even fall on me or a small child. The area is very busy with cars at times, with children running around unsupervised.</p>
