Assessment

The applicant is seeking planning permission for alterations to convert garage to living accommodation.

The alterations to convert the garage to living accommodation would not increase the existing structure or footprint of the existing dwelling. The only external alterations would be the removal of the garage door to the front elevation and the installation of one window.

The windows would be framed in UPVC to match the existing. Within the interior of the dwelling, the garage conversion would create an extra bedroom.

Design and Visual Amenity:

The application site refers to a two-storey detached dwelling erected within the last 10 years. The property benefits from a driveway to the front and garden amenity space to the front and rear. The property is constructed from brick with white UPVC windows. The dwelling is situated within a new housing estate with properties of a similar age and style.

Consideration has been given here in terms of the proposals impact on the local character and street scene.

Conditions and Reasons

1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within three years of the date of this permission.

Reason: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision

notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and to accord with Policies LP1, LP2, LP21, LP22, LP24 and LP51 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principles 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 15 and 16 of the Council's adopted House Extensions & Alterations Supplementary Planning Document and Policies within Chapters 2, 9, 12 and 14 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

3. Notwithstanding the plans submitted the external materials of construction used in relation to the external alterations of the development hereby approved shall in all respects match those used in the construction of the existing building and be retained thereafter.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and in accordance with Policies LP01, LP02 & LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principles 1 and 2 the Council's adopted House Extensions and Alterations Supplementary Planning Document and policies within Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

4. The extension hereby approved shall not be brought into use until all areas indicated to be used for car parking on the approved plans have been laid out with a hardened and drained surface in accordance with the Communities and Local Government; and Environment Agency's 'Guidance on the permeable surfacing of front gardens (parking areas)' published 2009 as amended or any successor guidance; Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 as amended (or any Order revoking or re-enacting that Order) these areas shall be so retained thereafter.

Reason: In the interests of amenity and traffic safety, to ensure adequate space within the site for parking, to mitigate flood risk through surface water run-off and in accordance with Policy LP24 (d) (vii) of the Kirklees Local Plan, Key Design Principle 14 of the House Extensions and Alterations SPD and Chapter 14 of the National Planning Policy.

NOTE: The changes to the access within the adopted highway fronting the property will need to be constructed under a section 184 agreement of the 1980 Highways Act (vehicle crossings over footways and verges). You are required to consult the Design Engineer (Kirklees Street Scene: 01484 221000) with regard to obtaining this permission and approval of the construction specification. Interference with the highway without such permission is an offence which could lead to prosecution.

NOTE: The Council's GIS system indicates that the property is within a bat roost area and may be present on site. Bats are a European protected species under regulation 41 of the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2010. It is an offence for anyone to intentionally to kill, injure or handle a bat, disturb a roosting bat, or sell or offer a bat for sale without a licence. It is also an offence to damage, destroy or obstruct access to any place used by bats for shelter, whether they are present or not. If bats are discovered on site development shall cease and the applicant is advised to contact Natural England for advice.
