<p>Firstly I would like to make it known that I have not received any notification of this planning application. We have not received any letters to our address and there are no notices or signs. It was mentioned to me in passing a few days ago. I am concerned by how many other residents are not aware and have now missed the opportunity to voice their own concerns.</p> <p>I would like to refer to the supporting statement which states users of the site do not park on the surrounding streets and that residents have not made any complaints about the issues. This is incorrect. Despite the best efforts of the parking attendants, users are still seen parking further up Wellington street, perhaps considering themselves out of sight, as well as on surrounding streets. Presumably due to either the inconvenience of navigating the site entrance/exit or due to lack of parking on site. I have witnessed neighbours having to ask drivers to move their vehicles, on one occasion parked on the double yellow lines. To lose another parking space with this extension would not improve this situation as there are clearly already more than 20 users and I assume one of the reasons for the extension is to increase the number of users.</p> <p>The vehicle entrance/exit is situated on Wellington Street and creates a high volume of traffic in a very concentrated area. The risk to pedestrians and residents parked vehicles is very concerning. I would recommend a visit to the site at 1.30pm on any Friday to grasp the full extent of the issues.</p> <p>A further concern is how a larger extension would increase the already obvious light and noise pollution to the area, which occurs late into the evenings. I think it is pertinent to remind everyone that Wellington Street is a residential area, not a business area and there is a constant lack of consideration to its residents.</p> <p>With the loss of a parking space I don't see how the parking situation will improve. With the upcoming high fees for residential parking permits, to see the surroundings streets being used because there is not parking left on site is simply unacceptable and I oppose any planning applications.</p>
