I am emailing to object to the planning application 2024/92992 for the click and collect box outside the shop on Leeds Road in Birstall.

The installation of this box without prior planning permission has already led to significant traffic disruptions, particularly during peak hours on Leeds Rd. Delivery vans regularly stop on Leeds Road, causing a bottleneck that affects the flow of traffic and creates unsafe conditions for both drivers and pedestrians. Additionally, residents have already been reporting difficulties accessing their driveways due to vehicles stopping to pick up and drop off deliveries, further exacerbating the situation.

Given these concerns, I strongly urge the refusal of this application. It is vital that we prioritise the safety and accessibility of our roads, particularly in areas already struggling with traffic congestion. I believe that a more suitable solution can be found that does not impede local residents and ensures smoother traffic flow.
