KIRKLEES COUNCIL (hereinafter called "The Council") as Local Planning
Authority hereby permits:-**

OUTLINE APPLICATION FOR ERECTION OF DWELLING AND ASSOCIATED
WORKS (WITHIN A CONSERVATION AREA)

At: ADJ, 42, LONG CROFT STREET, GOLCAR, HUDDERSFIELD, HD7 4EA

**In accordance with the plan(s) and applications submitted to the Council on
28-Oct-2024, subject to the condition(s) specified hereunder:-**

1. Approval of the details of Appearance, Scale and Landscaping of the site (hereinafter called the 'reserved matters') shall be obtained from the Local Planning Authority in writing before development is commenced.

Reason: This is a pre-commencement condition to comply with the provisions of Section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, as amended by Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, and Article 5(1) of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2015 (as amended).

2. Plans and particulars of the reserved matters referred to in Condition 1 above, relating to Appearance, Scale and Landscaping of the site, shall be submitted in writing to the Local Planning Authority and shall be carried out in full accordance with the approved plans.

Reason: No details of the matters referred to having been submitted they are reserved for the subsequent approval in writing of the Local Planning Authority.

3. Application for approval of any reserved matters shall be made to the Local Planning Authority before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

4. The development hereby permitted shall be begun either before the expiration of two years from the final approval of reserved matters or, in the case of approval on different dates, the final approval of the last such matter to be approved.

Reason: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

5. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and so as to ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, and to accord Policies LP1, LP2, LP3, LP7, LP20, LP21, LP22, LP24, LP28, LP30, LP31, LP35, LP51 & LP52 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principles within the Housebuilders Design Guide Supplementary Planning Document and policies within Chapters 2, 4, 5, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14, 15 & 16 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

6. The residential development hereby approved shall not exceed a maximum of one dwelling.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt as to what is authorised by this permission to ensure that the development conforms to the approved outline planning permission as well as the impact upon residential amenity of neighbouring occupiers and visual amenity of the wider locality to accord with policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principles 2, 6, 16 & 17 of the Council's adopted Housebuilders Design Guide and policies within Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

7. Development shall not commence until a scheme has been submitted to, and approved in writing by, the Local Planning Authority which details all materials of construction. The submitted scheme shall include all external walls, gutters, downpipes, windows, doors and roofing materials including their colour finish. The dwelling shall not be brought into use until completed from the materials and colour finishes approved by this condition, which shall thereafter be retained.

Reason: This is a pre-commencement condition to ensure that the new dwelling is sympathetic to the surrounding built form, in accordance with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan and the aims of the National Planning Policy Framework.

8. Development shall not commence until a scheme detailing the finished slab and floor levels of the dwelling hereby approved, together with corresponding existing and finished ground levels and of surface and land drainage associated with any works, has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The construction of the dwelling shall be carried out in accordance with the details so approved and the occupation of the dwelling hereby approved shall not take place until the works relating to the building have been completed. The approved levels shall be so retained for the lifetime of the development, unless otherwise approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: This is a pre commencement condition required in the interests of visual and residential amenity to accord with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principle 15 of the Housebuilders Design Guide SPD and Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

9. The development hereby approved shall not be brought into use until a scheme detailing the installation of all boundary treatments has been submitted to, and approved in writing by, the Local Planning Authority. The submitted scheme shall include details of location, heights and materials. The boundary treatments shall be completed prior to the development being brought into use and retained thereafter.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and residential amenity and to accord with Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan and policies within Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

10. Before construction work commences a report specifying the measures to be taken to protect the development from noise from all significant noise sources that are likely to affect the proposed development including rail related noise shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The report shall:

- a) Determine the existing noise climate
- a) Predict the noise climate in living rooms and gardens (daytime), bedrooms (nighttime) and other habitable rooms of the development
- b) Detail the proposed attenuation/design necessary to protect the amenity of the occupants of the new residences (including ventilation if required).

The development shall not be occupied until all works specified in the approved report have been carried out in full and such works shall be thereafter retained.

Reason: To protect the amenity of occupiers of the proposed development from noise or disturbance from nearby noise generating premises to accord with the aims of Policies LP24 and LP52 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapters 12 and 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

11. The development shall not be brought into use until all areas to be hard surfaced for access and parking have been and out with a hardened and drained surface in accordance with the Communities and Local Government; and Environment Agency's 'Guidance on the permeable surfacing of front gardens (parking areas)' published 13th May 2009 (ISBN 9781409804864) as amended or any successor guidance. These areas shall be so retained, free of obstructions and available for access and parking.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity, highway safety and to mitigate flood risk. To accord with Policies LP21, LP22, LP24 and LP28 of the Kirklees Local Plan.

12. One bat box, in the form of a Schwegler type 1FR woodcrete bat box or similar, shall be installed on the exterior of the approved dwelling before first occupation. The box shall be at least 4 metres above the ground and not located above windows or doors. The box shall thereafter be retained.

Reason: In the interests of enhancing the biodiversity value of the site, in accordance with Policy LP30 of the Kirklees Local Plan and Chapter 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

13. Groundworks shall not commence until actual or potential land contamination at the site has been investigated and a Preliminary Risk Assessment (Phase I Desk Study Report) by a suitably competent person has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraph nos. 183 and 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

14. Where further intrusive investigation is recommended in the Preliminary Risk Assessment approved pursuant to condition 13 groundworks (other than those required for a site investigation report) shall not commence until a Phase II Intrusive Site Investigation Report by a suitably competent person has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraph nos. 183 and 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

15. Where site remediation is recommended in the Phase II Intrusive Site Investigation Report approved pursuant to condition 14 further groundworks shall not commence until a Remediation Strategy by a suitably competent person has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The Remediation Strategy shall include a timetable for the implementation and completion of the approved remediation measures.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraph nos. 183 and 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

16. Remediation of the site shall be carried out and completed in accordance with the Remediation Strategy approved pursuant to condition 15. In the event that remediation is unable to proceed in accordance with the approved Remediation Strategy or contamination not previously considered [in either the Preliminary Risk Assessment or the Phase II Intrusive Site Investigation Report] is identified or encountered on site, all groundworks in the affected area (except for site investigation works) shall cease immediately and the Local Planning Authority shall be notified in writing within 2 working days. Works shall not recommence until proposed revisions to the Remediation Strategy have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Remediation of the site shall thereafter be carried out in accordance with the approved revised Remediation Strategy.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraph nos. 183 and 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

17. Following completion of any measures identified in the approved Remediation Strategy or any approved revised Remediation Strategy a Verification Report by a suitably competent person shall be submitted to the Local Planning Authority. No part of the site shall be brought into use until such time as the remediation measures have been completed for the site in accordance with the approved Remediation Strategy or the approved revised Remediation Strategy and a Verification Report in respect of those remediation measures has been approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: To ensure the safe occupation of the site in accordance with Policy LP53 of the Kirklees Local Plan and paragraph nos. 183 and 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

NOTE: A sewer crosses the site. The response of Yorkshire Water is brought to the attention of the applicant / development which states that there is a 225 mm diameter public combined water sewer recorded to cross the site. It is essential that the presence of this infrastructure is taken into account in the design of the scheme insofar as: a.) It may not be acceptable to raise or lower ground levels over the sewer and we will not accept any inspection chambers on the sewer to be built over; b.) In this instance, Yorkshire Water would look for this matter to be controlled (by Requirement H4 of the Building Regulations 2010) and c.) A proposal by the developer to alter/divert a public sewer will be subject to Yorkshire Water's requirements and formal procedure in accordance with Section 185 Water Industry Act 1991.'

NOTE: The applicants' attention is drawn to the [response](#) of Network Rail including the [informative notes](#) accompanying their response.

NOTE: All noise assessments should be carried out by a competent person. The applicant may wish to contact the Association of Noise Consultants <http://www.association-of-noiseconsultants.co.uk/> (020 8253 4518) or the Institute of Acoustics <http://www.ioa.org.uk> (0300 999 9675) for a list of members.

NOTE: All contamination reports shall be prepared by a suitably competent person, as defined in Annex 2 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2021. Reports must be prepared in accordance with the following guidance:

- *Land Contamination Risk Management (LCRM)*
- *BS 10175:2011+ A2:2017 Investigation of Potentially Contaminated Sites. Code of Practice*
- *Development on Land Affected by Contamination - Technical Guidance for Developers, Landowners & Consultants - (v11.2) June 2020* by the Yorkshire and Lincolnshire Pollution Advisory Group.

The conditions relate to Planning Control only. Approval under the Building Regulations may also be required, and the applicant should contact their Building Control Provider for further information. Any other necessary consent must be obtained from the appropriate authority. If the applicant commences work without discharging conditions, they will be at risk of enforcement action and invalidating the permission if the planning condition is a pre commencement condition.

NOTE: The changes to the access within the adopted highway fronting the property, to provide a dropped kerb, will need to be constructed under a section 184 agreement of the 1980 Highways Act (vehicle crossings over footways and verges). You are required to consult the Design Engineer (Kirklees Street Scene: 01484 221000) with regard to obtaining this permission and approval of the construction specification. Interference with the highway without such permission is an offence which could lead to prosecution.

NOTE: Kirklees Council has powers under Section 60 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 to control noise from construction sites and may serve a notice imposing requirements on the way in which construction works are to be carried out. It has additional powers under Sections 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 to prevent statutory nuisance including noise, dust, smoke and artificial light and must serve an abatement notice when it is satisfied that a statutory nuisance exists or is likely to occur or recur. Failure to comply with a notice served using the above-mentioned legislation would be an offence for which the maximum fine on summary conviction is unlimited.

NOTE: With regard to land stability, it is brought to the applicant / developers' attention that responsibility for securing a safe development rests with the developer and/or landowner.

Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your Local Planning Authority to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- If an enforcement notice is served or has been served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against the local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within:
 - i) 28 days from the date of this notice where the enforcement notice has been served,
 - ii) 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice or,
 - iii) the specified period starting from the date of this notice,whichever period expires earlier.
- If you want to appeal against your Local Planning Authority's decision then you must do so within the specified period, starting on the date of this notice.
- The "specified period" is 12 weeks where the development relates to a "minor commercial application" as defined within the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) Order 2010 (as amended), or 6 months in any other case.
- Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or at [the Planning Inspectorates website](http://www.planninginspectorates.gov.uk). Further information on the Planning Appeal process can be found online at [the Planning Inspectorates website](http://www.planninginspectorates.gov.uk)

- You must use the correct Planning Appeal Form when making your appeal. If requesting forms from the Planning Inspectorate, please state the type of application that the appeal relates to so they can send you the appeal form you require.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the Local Planning Authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.
- In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based their decision on a direction given by him.

Please note, only the applicant possesses the right of appeal.

Purchase Notices

- If either the Local Planning Authority or the Secretary of State refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.

In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council. This notice will require the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
