Plans look promising -

Increased parking space will help greatly - like the cycle parking & electric charging points etc.  
What is undercroft parking?

New look will improve the area. Especially setting is back away from the main road, which is an issue with the present building.

Green spaces and wildlife habitats - fantastic idea; look to how Cambridge Central Masjid have incorporated these in to their masjid space for inspiration.

Library (who will this be open to?), Gym (why not open it up to the community, not just students?) & Counselling - great ideas to make the masjid multi-functional and appropriate to the needs of the wider community. A local one-stop hub insha'Allah.

How will safety of pedestrians in and out of the masjid, especially children, if there is an increase in pupils/footfall be ensured? The bigger the madrasah, the greater the number of cars and inappropriate parking at madrasah times, congestion, inconvenience etc.

Would zebra crossings, islands or pedestrian crossings be worth looking in to to help especially the pupils to cross this busy road?

How are you going to encourage people to walk to the masjid instead of using their cars?

How many pupils will the new premises be looking to accommodate?  
How many mussallees?

Will there be women's prayer facilities and ablution area? We need one in the area.

Most masjids fundraise with the promise of women's facilities and prayer spaces, and then go back on their word once work is completed and women only have spaces for daytime/evening classes - women need a connection with the masjid as much as men. As well as the children who mothers will be bringing in to the masjid - we need to build the next generation up who have a love of the masjid - it needs to be accessible to both girls and boys, men and women; women are being left out from one of the key areas of Muslim life at a time when they need it most for their spiritual needs.

Have you thought about outdoor spaces / break out spaces for children/ youth for recreational purposes? It is better to have our children in/around the masjid than elsewhere.

Do you engage with the non-Muslim community in the area (not in a tokenistic way eg. at Ramadhan or Eid) throughout the year? If so, how so?

Are the minarets really necessary? Couldn't the money that will be going towards them (minarets serve no purpose in this age except as a marker or for aesthetic purposes) towards something more beneficial?

Glad to see their is no dome - domes also serve no purpose except for aesthetic purposes - our masjids should work well with the environment that they are built in.

Consultation with the community a very positive step - may the best version of the plans that are going to be beneficial for the community prevail, Ameen!

Thoughts on the organisation and the service it provides for all in the community:

Healey Islamic Trust has been a blessing for the Healey community. Since its opening in 2019, the mosque has been pivotal in creating a community spirit amongst the residents of Healey, through:

- the 5 daily prayers
- weekly and monthly events which bring young and old from the community together
- Weekly outreach programmes where a group of individuals visit residents door to door to enquire on their spiritual health and general wellbeing
- A safe space for women of all ages to come and interact with each other.
- Employment for both men and women. The majority of staff employed at the Trust are women
- Daily classes which focus on spiritual development for young boys and girls, men and women
- Yearly residential from the mosque which focuses on creating unity and encouraging more involvement from members of the community
- The mosque is a favourite amongst young children and teenagers - the mosque runs daily evening classes which keeps kids off the streets and occupied with extra curricular activities. On a weekend, the mosque is frequently visited by many young people across healey. The mosque is doing a great job in keeping young people off the streets and building their character to eventually become good contributors to society
- The Imaams deliver daily reminders and lectures which focuses on spiritual and character development. Their lectures have been a cause of many individuals improving their lives
- The Imaams have provided a tremendous service of helping individuals navigate their way out of troubles through dedicating hours and hours of 1-1 time with them.
- The group of individuals and volunteers that run the masjid have done an excellent job of working cohesively with the Imaams and worshippers on creating a welcoming environment which encourages all members of the community to get involved in the activities taking place in the mosque. The mosque also hosts school visits and these are popular amongst the kids from school.

Issues with current site which the revised plans will resolve:

- parking issues: the site struggles with parking for Friday prayers. The revised plans will resolve this issue. The site has ample space for parking with the propose underground parking and ground level parking. This coupled with the bike racks will significantly reduce any parking issues the trust currently has.
- The site is too small: the mosque and evening school has outgrown the current space used to deliver its services. The space is benefiting the local residents and residents from Heckmondwike, Liversidge and Spen. The proposed increase space will ensure the mosque can continue to provide its services efficiently and expand on the current services it's providing which will build further on the amazing community work taking place. More kids will attend the evening school, ensuring they're off the streets and building their moral conduct.
- The site is an eyesore: currently the site is old, outdated and an eyesore for the Healey area. Converting this site into the proposed plans will significantly improve the aesthetics of the area and the site will be a landmark for the area of Healey

My concluding comments and thoughts are this mosque is providing a critical service to the community. Before the mosque came, the community was disjointed and lacking life. Since the mosque opened, it has been a source of life being injected into the community, creating unity and deep sense of purpose for all. It has completely transformed the community and been a space for all to come together. The worshippers of the mosque are very helpful, often in the winter months, in the early hours of the morning, they're seen helping road users of Healey lane when it snows. They use their own sand and shovels and push cars to get them to safety.
