PLANNING PERMISSION FOR DEVELOPMENT

In pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Act and Order the KIRKLEES COUNCIL (hereinafter called "The Council") as Local Planning Authority hereby permits:-

ERECTION OF 2 GARDEN PODS

At: 3D, BROAD LANE, UPPERTHONG, HOLMFIRTH, HD9 3JS

In accordance with the plan(s), documents and application submitted to the Council on 16-Dec-2024, except as amended or specified, details of which can be found in the table below and subject to the condition(s) specified hereunder:-

1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun within three years of the date of this permission.

Reason: Pursuant to the requirements of Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

2. The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in complete accordance with the plans and specifications schedule listed in this decision notice, except as may be specified in the conditions attached to this permission, which shall in all cases take precedence.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt as to what is being permitted and so as to ensure the satisfactory appearance of the development on completion, to accord with Policies LP1, LP2, LP21, LP22 and LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, principles 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 13, 15 and 16 of the Council's adopted Supplementary Planning Document on House Extensions and Alterations, Policies 1 and 2 of the Holme Valley Neighbourhood Development Plan and to accord with Policies within Chapters 2, 4, 12, 14 and 15 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

3. The external walls of the outbuildings hereby approved shall be constructed in timber and composite cladding which shall be retained thereafter.

Reason: In the interests of visual amenity and to accord with Policies LP1, LP2 and LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Key Design Principles 1, 2 and 9 of the Council's adopted Supplementary Planning Document on House Extensions, Policies 1 and 2 of the Holme Valley Neighbourhood Development Plan and to accord with Policies within Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

4. The development hereby approved shall not be used for any purpose other than as ancillary accommodation in connection with 3D, Broad Lane, Upperthong, Holmfirth, HD9 3JS.

Reason: In the interests of the amenity of the occupiers of the development hereby approved and neighbouring properties and access and highway safety to accord with policies LP21, LP22 and LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, the Council's adopted Highway Design Guide and policies contained within chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

5. Notwithstanding the submitted plans the roofs of the outbuildings hereby approved shall not be used as any form of amenity space, a balcony, a raised terrace and/or a raised platform at any time.

Reason: To ensure that the development does not result in a loss of amenity of the adjoining property and to accord with the requirements of Policy LP24 of the Kirklees Local Plan, Principles 3 and 4 of the House Extensions and Alterations SPD, Policy 2 of the Home Valley Neighbourhood Development Plan and Policies within Chapter 12 of the National Planning Policy Framework.

NOTE: Paragraph 184 of the National Planning Policy Framework states that where a site is affected by contamination or land stability issues, responsibility for securing a safe development rests with the developer and/or landowner.

NOTE: The Council's GIS system indicates that the property is within a bat roost area and may be present on site. Bats are a European protected species under regulations of the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017. It is an offence for anyone to intentionally to kill, injure or handle a bat, disturb a roosting bat, or sell or offer a bat for sale without a licence. It is also an offence to damage, destroy or obstruct access to any place used by bats for shelter, whether they are present or not. If bats are discovered on site development shall cease and the applicant is advised to contact Natural England for advice.

The agent was contacted regarding the distances between the proposed outbuildings and neighbouring properties. The agent responded with plans which showed the proposed outbuildings with relation to existing neighbours and these distances clearly measured.

Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your Local Planning Authority to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- As this is a decision for a householder application, if you want to appeal against your Local Planning Authority's decision to impose planning conditions then you must do so within 6 months of the date of this notice.
- If an enforcement notice is served or has been served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against the local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice.
- Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or online at <https://www.gov.uk/appeal-householder-planning-decision> . Further information on the Planning Appeal process can be found online at the Planning Inspectorates website <https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/planning-inspectorate>.
- You must use the correct Planning Appeal Form when making your appeal. If requesting forms from the Planning Inspectorate, please state the type of application that the appeal relates to so they can send you the appeal form you require.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the local planning authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order and to any directions given under a development order.

- In practice, the Secretary of State does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the Local Planning Authority based their decision on a direction given by him.

Please note, only the applicant possesses the right of appeal.

Purchase Notices

- If either the local planning authority or the Secretary of State refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that the owner can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.

In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the Council. This notice will require the Council to purchase the owner's interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Chapter I of Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
